"Jesus, I will ponder now on Thy holy Passion!"


PICTORIAL DIRECTORY. .

like as much furniture, as well as working appliances, as possible.



Let's all get behind this sale so our contribution to the Building Fund will be a big one!


MORLD HUNGER: 1.21.




THE CARPENTER.


