
A report of convention highlights will be given to the congregation later in the summer.



SUMMER GROWTH...

With the celebration of Pentecost, we enter the "non-festival" half of the church year.
During the Pentecost season
(which extends until Advent) the
color is green and the emphasis
is on Christian growth. We will
be thinking about growing in our

Christian faith through the power of the Spirit. Just as we need food and nourishment to keep living and growing, so we as Christians must remain faithful in our hearing of God's Word and reception of Holy Communion to live and grow as Christians. As we grow, God works through us to reach those who do not yet know Him and His love as we do As we think about this, let me share a short parable with you:

"Fred Somebody, Thomas Everybody, Deter Anybody, and Joe Nobody were neighbors, but they weren't like you and me. They were odd people and most difficult to understand. The way they lived was a shame. All four belonged to the same church, but you wouldn't have enjoyed worshiping with them. EVERYBODY went fishing on Sunday or stayed home to visit with his friends. ANYBODY wanted to worship, but was afraid SOMEBODY wouldn't speak to him. So guess who went to church—NOBODY. Really, NOBODY was the only decent one of the four. NOBODY did the visitation. NOBODY worked on the church building. Once they needed a Sunday School teacher. EVERYBODY thought ANYBODY would do it, and ANYBODY thought SOMEBODY would do it. Guess who finally did it—NOBODY! It happened that a fifth neighbor (an unbeliever) moved into the area. EVERYBODY thought SOMEBODY should try to win him for Christ. ANYBODY could have made an effort, but as it turned out, NOBODY took the initiative."

Each one of us who claims membership in Christ's Church is responsible for carrying out the work that God has given us to do. We are people on a mission—the mission of sharing our faith in Jesus with others, wherever and however we can.

This parable contains a world of truth. Instead of spending time trying to figure out how it applies to other members and past situations in our congregation, we might each spend time considering how it applies to our own lives and our own relationship with Christ and His Church. You simply cannot look to SOMEBODY, EVERYBODY, or ANYBODY else to do what you know needs to be done. If we are not concerned enough to become involved and see that it gets done, NOBODY will do it.



New cleaning guidelines are available from Gert if you don't have yours.




