



Our support of the Community Care Fund (to help transients with food, etc.) and the local Teen Center (to provide an alternative for our youth) is not only a response of faith on our part to help with specific needs, but it also shows our friends and nieghbors in our community that we are concerned and willing to help. This is part of the Lord's work that we are doing.

+Your love and friendship has been appreciated by our family. We especially thank you for your money gift which we received at the Christmas party. We have put that money toward a towel and linen cabinet made for us by Lou Volberding.

+Blessings to you in 1983: May the Lord bless the work we do together this year in His Name and for His Kingdom.




