

#### SO WHAT IS LENT??

Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, March 7th. But what's Lent, you say? For those who may not be sure, let me explain.

Lent is a season of the Church Year which has its roots in the Early Church. It evolved into a 40-day period (not counting Sundays) before Easter, and was a time of fasting and preparation. Lent



begins on Ash Wednesday and reaches its joyful climax on the Festival of the Lord's Resurrection.

The Early Church used Lent as an instruction period for new converts as they prepared for their baptisms, which took place before dawn on Easter morning. It still carries a sense of preparation, as God's people use it to prepare for the events of Holy Week, ending with Easter.

Lent is a penitential season, so its color is purple. It is a time devoted to the study of God's Word and reflection on the meaning of Christ's suffering for us.

I invite you to take advantage of the special worship opportunities this Lenten season, that we may grow in our faith as we ponder our Lord's passion.

#### BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT...



During the past eighteen months, the Building Committee has been working to solve the long-term facility need of our growing congregation. Earlier this year, we advised the congregation that a new church in a new location would be the best way to meet these needs. We asked for specific pledges of time, talent, and money so we could determine if building a new church would be possible. Your response to the pledge

request was very good. The congregation pledged \$35,000 to put in savings with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund. This would allow the congregation to borrow \$100,000 from Church Extension for a building project. Members also pledged \$60,000 in gifts to the Building Fund over a three-year period. Many hours of time and talent were also pledged. Our present church has not been appraised, but the Building Committee believes that the value is \$100,000.

By totalling the gifts, the value of the existing church, and the amount the congregation can borrow, the Building Committee determined that the total building budget could be around \$260,000.

The Building Committee asked the Voters' Assembly to make official application for Laborers for Christ through the Rocky Mountain District Office of the Lutheran Church. The application was made and the congregation may have the services of this group during the summer of 1985. Laborers for Christ, along with pledged time and talent from our members, should reduce the square-foot cost of the building from 1/3 to 1/2. The estimated cost of the building is \$160,000 for the initial phase, which would be about twice as large as our present church.

The most difficult problem for the Building Committee has been finding a site for a new church that would meet the budget constrainst, and also meet other important criteria for a church location. A church should be near the center of the area served; should be in or near a residential area as opposed to commercial, industrial or rural areas; should be easy to get to, preferably on a major secondary road of street. A church should be visible. Visibility is increased by being near frequently visited facilities, such as public schools or grocery stores. It should also be located in a neutral area in the community served. That is, a church should not be identified as

being part of a subdivision unless that is the area to be served.

In our search for a site, the committee asked for the advice of Pastor Raabe, the Rocky Mountain District Mission Director, and Vance Hinrichs, a real estate broker who has wide experience in purchasing church property. As a result of their advice, we concentrated our search in the southeast part of Steamboat Springs. We have reviewed sites on Whistlers Road, near Tree Haus, on Anglers Drive, in Emerald Mountain Meadows, and on Fish Creek Falls Road. We evaluated these sites against the criteria listed previously. The Building Committee felt the Whistler Road site was getting too far from the center of the area served and the price was a little beyond our budget goal. Sites around Tree Haus have high development costs, and could be identified with a subdivision. Visibility in this area would be good. The Anglers Drive locations would have good visibility and accessibility, since they are near the Safeway store and Sundance Plaza. However, the asking price on these sites exceeds our total building budget. A site on Emerald Mountain Meadows (behind Arby's) would meet the budget, but visibility and accessibility would be only fair. Sites on Fish Creek Road have poor accessibility because of the steep grade of Fish Creek Road and community visibility is fair to poor.

The Building Committee has found one site that we feel meets the budget requirement and fulfills the other criteria to a satisfactory degree. This is a 4 acre site located at the intersection of Maple and Amethyst, on the east side of Amethyst. Spring Creek is just north of the property. The High School is across Amethyst Street to the west. The site is surrounded by dedicated green-belt on the east and north. The site has high community visibility because it is near the only public high school. Accessibility is good. The area development is residential. The owner has offered to sell the property for \$115,000 cash or \$120,000 with terms. If the congregation would approve the site, it could possibly be subdivided, leaving the church with a 2 acre site and a net cost of approximately \$70,000 after the sal of the extra lots. This would be within the proposed building budget.

Please consider this proposed church site carefully. The Building Committee has a very positive feeling that this is the best one we can get within the budget constraints. We feel it would be a good location if cost were not a concern. Because of the green-belt, the church would never appear crowded by residential housing. The church would always stand out. The natural vegetation on the site would keep landscaping costs low. Sewer and water lines are close to the property.

The Building Committee assumes that the congregation's goal is to build a new church. Over the past eighteen months, we have reported on our findings and asked for your direction at the Voters' meetings. All your actions at the voters' meetings indicated that building a church was your eventual goal. The congregation will be able to control the pace of the building program. As a congregation, we can reach our goal without stress financially if we use good planning, but we still have to take that first step.


