

Discussions are continuing to try to resolve some differences of opinion between the city and our congregation concerning the property we wish to buy on Amethyst Dr. Unfortunately, we have not yet met our investment goal of \$44,000 in the Lutheran Church Extension Fund so that we can receive our loan money when it will be needed to close on the property. As of June 6, we had \$30,589 invested, which is 69.5% of our goal. It is very important that if you have not yet invested what you can to LCEF, that you would do so immediately. You are also encouraged to contact friends and relatives and ask for their help and support. A friend of the congregation in Calif. has invested \$6,500 and Calif. relatives of a member family have invested \$1,000. Let's reach our goal NOW!

FAMILY THOUGHTS...



With Father's Day upon us, I want to share some thoughts from Dr. Ralph Bohlmann, president of our church body. They come from an article entitled "They Have Only Just Begun", in the June '84 copy of The Lutheran Layman. He is talking specifically of confirmands, but his thoughts apply to all families with children.



"Conclusions of a recently published three-year study of young adolescents and their parents suggest that the Lord has blessed our church through Christian education ministries such as confirmation instruction. Compared to 12 other denominations participating in the study, the Synod's youth are less affected by the trend of young people falling away from the church. While the study generally shows that young people decline in their interest and commitment to 'religion' from the 5th to the 9th grades, the Synod's 7th and 8th-graders and their parents ranked higher than the norm with respect to the centrality of God in their lives. Higher than average acceptance of the Bible as God's Word and Truth, greater frequency of prayer, commitment, involvement in church activities, and more conversations about religion were evident among the youth of the Synod.

"The survey showed that while there is a strong orientation to God and church, our youth tend to display less ability to live out their faith by verbalizing the Good News of Christ Jesus' victorious death and resurrection. Some puzzling statistics also emerged from the survey. For example, the Synod's parents use more alcohol than average and smoke more. Our young people also tend to use slightly more alcohol than average but they smoke less than youth in the 12 other denominations. Also, there are indicators in the survey that our parents are less inclined to give physical and verbal expression of affection and that our fathers express being angry with their

children more than the norm.

"What do statistics like this suggest to us? They remind us of the importance of talking with - not only to - our young people as full-fledged believers in Christ. We need to let them see and understand how much the love of God in Jesus Christ means to us. Youth and parents alike need the help of other Christian adults to support them in 'seasons' that follow the time of confirmation. The confirmand's visions and dreams can become a reality in significant work, study, and fellowship in the communion of saints."

May God bless our families at Concordia as parents and children strive to share the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ with each other, and grow to-

gether as members of the Body of Christ.
