
This will be a great opportunity not only for an ourstanding meal but some good fellowship as well. Pick up your tickets and a few extra to sell. All proceeds go to the building fund.

COOL AS A CUCUMBER . . .

During the heat of the summer, let me share with you an article written by Pastor Stephen Hower in the newsletter of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Groves, Texas (Ella Jurischk's former congregation).

"Have you ever heard the expression, "as cool as a cucumber?" Did you know that the expression has its origin in scientific fact? That's right! A cucumber lying in the direct

sunlight on the hottest day is cooler in the center than it is on the outside. The center can be as much as 10 degrees cooler than the outside!

"There is one 'catch'-to the cucumber's story. The temperature difference between the outside and inside of the vegetable exists <u>only</u> when the cucumber is attached to the vine. Once detached, a cucumber 'loses its cool.'

"Christians suffering the heat of trial can learn a lesson from our garden friend. Inasmuch as we remain firmly 'attached' to christ...remember, 'He is the vine and we are the branches' (John 15:1-10), we too can be facing tremendous 'heat' on the outside while remaining appreciatively 'cooler' inside where it counts. It's not just a cute illustration useful for preachers as sermon fodder. You yourself have witnessed faithful Christians bear up under enormous burdens, strengthened by Jesus and little else.

"Shadrack, Meshack and Abednego were cast into a fiery furnace (hot enough to kill those who tossed them in!) and yet they were unharmed. Daniel, chapter 3 says they were not even singed nor was the smell of smoke found on their clothes. The apostles were beaten and harassed, but they continued to rejoice in the Lord (Acts 4:5-41). The writer of Hebrews summarizes the outcome of the faithful in chapter 11(take out your Bibles and read it).

"No one is exempt from trials of life nor from the certainty of death. Only those who are attached to the life-giving vine, Jesus Christ, can remain 'as cool as a cucumber' when fiery ordeals of life come. How are you holding up under the 'heat' of life? Are you attached to the Vine?"

Hope you can keep your cool, in Jesus...
