### WHERE ARE THE FLAGS?...

Some questions have been raised asking why the American and Christian flags that were in the chancel of our old church were not moved into the chancel of our new church. Let me share the thinking of the Interior Committee on this.

The noted worship expert, Paul H.D. Lang, writes in his book, Ceremony and Celebration:

"Flags and banners may be admitted into the church and chancel, but to place them in the sanctuary next to or near the altar or to lay the colors of Scouts or any society or organization on or near the altar is contrary to the dignity or purpose of the altar.

When both the United States flag and the socalled Christian flag are displayed in church, the most appropriate place to locate them is at the foot of the chancel. The United States flag should stand on the right side of the people facing the chancel and the church flag on the left". (page 185)

While flags may be appropriate in the chancel, they are not appropriate in the sanctuary (the area of the chancel behind the communion rails where the altar is located). Since there is not enough room to place the flags in front of the communion rail, the most appropriate location for them, as Lang suggests, is on the floor of the nave (the worship area where the pews are located).

However, this presents another problem. It was the feeling of the committee that there is not enough room to put the flags in the front of the nave without partially blocking the doors or obscuring part of the hymn boards, thus detracting from the planned design of the front of the church. The recommendation, therefore, was that the flags be displayed in the basement where they are visible during Sunday School activities and fellowship events.

I hope this information is helpful in explaining why the change was made.
