
ADULT BIBLE STUDY

ADVENT MUSINGS ...

"Happy New Year!" And so we greet one another on the first Sunday in Advent -- the beginning of a brand new Church Year. This year it falls on November 30th, the same day we celebrate the 50th Anniversary of our congregation's existence.

Advent is a season of spiritual preparation that leads up to the celebration of our Savior's birth at Christmas.
