

Our Sunday School children will tell the Christmas story in word and song.



ADVENTure School, a pre-Christmas learning experience for 3-5 year-olds, begins on November 30 and goes until December 4. Sessions are from 9-



HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Happy New Year! If you are thinking that I have flipped too many pages in my desk diary, let me remind you that the first Sunday in Advent (November 29) starts the New Church Year.

Advent is a season of spiritual preparation that gets us ready for the celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas. It is joyful preparation, but it has a "not-quite-yet" feeling to it as the time gets closer and more of our preparations are completed. (Using an Advent Calendar in our homes helps us with the countdown.) It is hard to make the most of Advent when the

world around us is already celebrating Christmas, but possibly not realizing that the celebration relates to the birth of a Savior from sin and death.

It is unfortunate that society and our personal schedules force us into celebrating Christmas prematurely (e.g., parties, etc., beginning early in December). That robs us of time and energy to physically and spiritually PREPARE-- for the celebration!

In days gone-by, when Advent was better understood, the celebration happened during the "12 Days of Christmas" -- from December 25 to January 6 (Epiphany). It is too bad that Christmas Day ends the celebration for so many, rather than begins it. It is too bad that the world wraps up the celebration at midnight on Christmas Day, burned out and tired from celebrating Christmas for the last month.

Advent gives us the chance to heed the Baptist's call to "Repent--Change!" It gives us the time to do our spiritual housecleaning, setting things in order in our lives so that the Christ Child can come and live in our hearts and be welcomed for Who he is and What he brings. "Ah, dearest Jesus, holy Child, make Thee a bed, soft, undefiled, within my heart, that it may be a quiet chamber kept for Thee." Have a rich and blessed Advent!

WHAT ARE WE GOING TO DO??

It seems like a long time ago when the first discussions of building a new church were started. At the time, there was much concern about not building enough or building too much. After many hours of reviewing numerous options, building sites, plans, etc., we selected a site and built our church-with help from the Laborers For Christ.



Our plan was to sell the old church and three building lots at the new church site to reduce the total debt load. The whole plan was very neat and tidy. We would end up with a modest debt and could cruise along with few worries, and fewer decisions to make.

Apparently our plan and the Lord's plan are not quite the same. Real estate prices and demand have fallen sharply. We sold the old church for much less than its 1984 appraisal value. The lots that would have sold for \$30,000 to \$40,000 in the late 70's or early 80's are not moving at half that price on today's market.

This situation, and our congregation's ministry needs, require a budget of over \$83,000. At our present rate of giving, we would fall short of this budget by about \$10,000. We have a decision to make and one of two paths to follow:

We could ask to go on subsidized status and become a mission congregation. Yes, the Rocky Mountain District would help us pay our bills. However, the District would also be closely involved in running our church and our congregational programs would be somewhat controlled by their directives.

Our other option is to give more. An increase of \$1.50 per communicant member per week would raise the necessary funds. This amount would be very hard for some of us. For others it would probably be easy.

We grew greatly in our service to our Savior and to each other during our building program. Many people gave time, talents, and treasure beyond expectations. How we decide to handle our current challenge may predict how rapidly we grow in Christ in the future.

What would the Apostle Paul say to us if he were to counsel us in our decision-making process? He might advise us much as he did the Corinthians in II Corinthians 8 and 9. In these chapters, Paul encourages the church at Corinth in their giving so that they will live up to prior commitments. He then sums it all up by returning the responsibility to the individual for deciding the size of his gifts. Please read these two chapters! They helped me decide what to do...I am just as proud as any of those Corinthians!





FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE INFO...


The Fellowship Committee will be concluding its first year in February, 1988. The Committee has tried to focus on the social and spiritual needs of all members.
