





### LENTEN WORSHIP...

The Season of Lent continues for the rest of this month, and there are still a number of special worship and growth opportunities planned for us. In the community, the remaining Wednesday Noonday Services are: March 9 --- Episcopal Church; March 16 --- Methodist Church; March 23 --- Catholic Church. Sewing kits for the LWML mission projects are still being collected. Items still needed include:


- -- 7 packages of sewing needles

## EASTER PREPARATIONS...

The early Christian Church prepared for Easter by preparing the new converts for their Baptisms on Easter day. This instruction and preparation time eventually developed into what we know as the Season of Lent. Baptism hooks us into the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ so that his blessings flow into our lives and empower us to live in a faithful relationship with him. In Holy Baptism we are watermarked as the people of God for time and for eternity.

"A resurrection has already taken place! We who were once spiritually dead have been called to life in Christ. God has washed us not only for today, but for eternity. Our life is lived now in his grace. Soon it shall be lived in his presence." (Pr. Timothy Knapp, Reporter 2/2/87).

I encourage you to prepare for Easter by not only remembering your own Baptism, but also those people for whom you are a <u>Baptismal Sponsor</u>. You have the opportunity each day to celebrate the power and wonder of your own Baptism. You can also help your Godchild prepare for Easter, even if s/he is an adult now. You promised to be concerned about his spiritual life, and now is a great time to renew that caring. Is s/he worshiping regularly? Is s/he communing regularly? Is s/he growing in the Word in Sunday School or Adult Class?

How about sending your Godchild an Easter card or letter, or making a phone call? Give encouragement to grow in Christ. Give encouragement to begin or continue regular worship of the Lord. Let her know that you remember her in your prayers.

May the Lord bless you as you prepare to celebrate his Resurrection. And may you rejoice in knowing that your Godchild is celebrating with you the love of Jesus. (Thanks to Pr. Norm Timmermann for some of the thoughts shared here. He is the father of one of my Godchildren.)

Maybe we should just seek opportunities to serve.


