### COME, HOLY SPIRIT!

Since we will celebrate the Festival of Pentecost this month, it is good for us to think again about the Holy Spirit and what he does for us as Christians. The Holy Spirit is part of the Godhead, true God along with the Father and the Son.

If it were not for the Holy Spirit, we would not be Christians. Paul reminds us that "no one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit" (1 Corinthians 12:3). By nature we

do not have the ability to believe in Jesus as our Savior. The faith that trusts in God is a gift, pure and simple. Natural man is spiritually blind, dead, and an enemy of God -- lacking the ability to love and trust him.

Paul says it this way, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith -- and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8). And Luther said in his Small Cathechism, "I believe that I cannot by my own understanding or effort believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him. But the Holy Spirit has called me through the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, and sanctified and kept me in true faith."

The Holy Spirit went to work in your life when you were baptized, if you were baptized as an infant; or through the Word of the Gospel, if you were not. A baptized infant is a Christian because the Spirit has brought him into a saving relationship with Jesus. That child does not have to "accept Christ" later in his life in order to become a Christian. He already has Christ in his life. Certainly he will grow in his understanding and appreciation of that relationship as he matures, but he will not become any more of a Christian. He will have the opportunity to confess his faith at Confirmation, for instance, as three of our young people will do on Pentecost day --- but he is already a Christian!

The Spirit works in your life through Word and Sacrament to keep you close to Jesus and to enable you to live for him. That completes the story, "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). Praise Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!
