

March 15 -- Holy Name Catholic Church




THE LUTHERAN WITNESS...

The Junior High class needs another tracher to share time with Dan Schuelke.



GETTING IT RIGHT...

Dr. Jay Rochelle, from the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago, tells how his young son learned to ride his sister's bike. When nobody was looking, he would drag it up the hill and ride it down. This went on for several days. When asked how he had done it, the boy said, "I just kept doing it until I got it right."

Dr. Rochelle says, "Lent is that season which reminds me of my son dragging that bike up the inclined driveway, riding it down, falling, getting up and trying all over again. It is the season for stubbed toes, bruised shins, and brush-burnt knees. It is the season for falling down and getting up and trying over again. We just keep doing it until we get it right.



"What is it we are trying to 'get right?' In early centuries of the church, what people got right was the faith itself...Lent was the time of instruction for candidates for baptism in their final period of intense catechesis.

"You see, the only way they could worship decently and in order, as Paul had said, was if they got it right. To be 'orthodox' (ortho=correct; dox=praise) means that you offer proper praise...This is education so that we 'get it right.'

"So Lent is the time for 'getting the story straight,' for remembering Christ as the one through whom we are graciously and sacrificially invited into the realm where Love reigns...

"Lent is the season to ask the question, 'Now tell me again, why do we focus all our energy on this Jesus person? Help me understand what he has to do with the Presence in my life'... The end is the praise of a God who so loved the world as to come among us in the form of a


total membership is making the decisions.
