

### LUTHERAN WORSHIP...

The Scriptures are full of encouragement for us to sing our praises to God. Music and singing have always been a big part of worship for God's people. This emphasis continued in the Lutheran Church, and our church became known as "the singing church". One of the first things Martin Luther did

after the Reformation was to produce a hymn book so that the people could

sing hymns in their own language.

Many hymn books have been produced through the centuries. The attempt has always been to include hymns that are Scripturally sound and that the people enjoy. The Lutheran Hymnal, presently in our pews, was first printed in 1941. It has served our church long and well, and has been the wor-

ship resource for several generations of Lutherans.

In the 1970's our church body felt that a new hymnal would be welcomed as a worship tool. This new hymnal was printed in 1982 with the name <a href="Lutheran Worship"><u>Lutheran Worship.</u></a>. Most of the churches in our church body have begun using this new hymnal in the last seven years. Perhaps you have run into it in your travels. The book offers some new and exciting settings for the liturgy as well as a broader selection of traditional and contemporary hymns. It is written in the language of today, rather than in King James English.

Our congregation has had other priorities during these past years which have kept us from seriously about this new hymnal. The Worship Committee now feels that it is time to introduce pieces of <u>Lutheran Worship</u> to the congregation so that later in the Fall we can possibly make a decision on getting and using this book. We will begin doing this in September.

Also, I will be leading the Adult Bible Class through a study of the various aspects of worship beginning on September 10. This will help us to better understand what we are doing when we worship, as well as expose us to parts of Lutheran Worship. Please join us!
