ANTIDOTE FOR APATHY...

The word "apathy" comes from the Greek "patheia" (feeling or passion) and "a" (a negative), causing it to mean "without feeling" or "indifference to what is happening." Apathy is no stranger to any of us. It seems to seep into our busy schedules and affects our spirits. Its effects can be seen in the community when there is a very low voter turnout for an election.

Apathy can also be a problem in the Church. Some of us are apathetic when it comes to worship, to Bible study, and to involvement in the life and work of our congregation. When

members do not worship for weeks on end; when only a handful of adults remain after worship for Bible study; or only ten people come to the September voters meeting; or only seven people take part in the congregational planning meeting, it appears we have a problem with apathy. There is an indifference to what is happening.

This month we will celebrate the Festival of the Reformation, thanking God that He preserved the pure Gospel message in His Church. This Gospel tells us that God's gift to us in Jesus is the forgiveness of our sins (even apathy) and the promise of eternal life. As the Holy Spirit works in our hearts through Word and Sacrament, He strengthens our faith and enables us to live for God alone.

The antidote for apathy is this grace of God at work in our lives bringing us to the realization that without Him we are, we have, and we can do nothing. Looking at the cross and remembering what Jesus has done for us will shake us out of our apathy and set us on the road of zealous discipleship. "Lord, help us to live our lives for you!"




COOKIE BAKE DAY ...

NEW PROGRAMS IN SUNDAY SCHOOL...

Several new "programs" are being introduced in Sunday School this year, of which parents and students need to be aware:

-JUICE TIME before Sunday School is at 10:15; Classes for adults and children begin at 10:30.

-Classes will be assigned their turns each week Parents will be asked to be involved in this.

-ATTENDANCE CERTIFICATES will be given at the end of each quarter to those students who have missed no more than 3 Sundays during the quarter. Students who visit another church and bring back a visitor card or bulletin will get credit (out-of-town on vacation, etc. -- not locally).

-MEMORY WORK has been assigned each class (2-year olds through Grade 8). Memory Work Sheets were sent home with students with their assignments for each quarter. As memory work is learned and recited to the teacher, it will be initialed on a quarterly form. Those students completing the quarter's memory work will be awarded a certificate.

-ATTENDANCE AND MEMORY WORK CERTIFICATES earned by the end of the Sunday School year can then be "traded in" for various levels of awards. A poster showing awards is on the basement bulletin board.

-A sign-up sheet for providing **COOKIES** for juice time is posted on the entry bulletin board. Can you help?

-BAPTISMAL BIRTHDAYS, as well as regular birthdays, will be celebrated on the last Sunday of the month. Please give your child's baptismal birth date to Sunday School Secretary Sandi Fornes as soon as possible!

Parents or students who have questions about any aspect of Sunday School are urged to talk either to individual teachers or to Superintendent Rosemary Schmoock.
