FOLLOW THE LEADER...

My wife and I drove to Salt Lake City last week to attend a conference. The trip was going well and the day was sunny until we hit a certain spot in the Utah mountains. Suddenly we found ourselves in a ground blizzard. The wind was blowing the snow so hard that our visibility was from zero to only several feet. As

we passed by, we could see cars that had driven off the side of the road. It was an anxious time for us.

We were able to make some very slow progress by watching the sticks along the side of the road, obviously placed there for just this kind of situation. Eventually we came upon a moving van. We felt some relief and were very happy to follow this truck at about three miles an hour, hoping that he knew where he was going. He did, and we and the other cars in our convoy were led safely through a very difficult situation.

As I reflected on this experience, it reminded me of how we are called by Jesus to follow him. In Holy Baptism, we were connected, not to a set of rules, but to a Person. As we travel through the ground blizzards of life's troubles and difficulties, we keep our eyes on Jesus and know that we are safe in his arms. We follow Jesus, trusting that he will lead us safely to our destination. He said, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6).
