
#### JOURNEY FEST...

### LENT-- ANOTHER CHANCE...

"How many times in your life have you wished for another chance? Another chance to take a test...to do a better job...to heal a hurt...to show your love. A person asks for another chance because he failed the first time. Because he thinks he can do better. Because he didn't realize how important it was. Usually people don't get another chance.

"That's what the Lenten season is all about. It is another chance to think about, and do something about, the most important fact in life -- that Christ suffered and died for

your sins so that you can have eternal life.

"Lent gives you another chance to think about that... Each year during Lent you have to view it again in terms of your life now. Do you understand how much God loves you? Do you really believe that his Son died for your sins? Do you live your live as though you believe it? Do your family and friends believe it?

"Can you believe it and not change something about your way of life? Can you believe it and not attend church services more often...or pray more regularly...or read your Bible more earnestly?

"That's the new chance that Lent gives you again this year. Do you dare let it pass without using its blessings? Will you have another chance after this one? Only God knows!"


