

WHAT DIRECTION SHOULD

WE TAKE?

Since the proposed Constitution and By-laws were not adopted at the April Voters' meeting (the vote--19 for, 16 against--was not the required 2/3 needed for approval), all of us at Concor-

dia need to asses where we want this congregation to go in the future.

The current Constitution served the congregation well in the past when our membership numbers were smaller and Steamboat Springs was a less mobile community. The lack of organizational structure in the current Constitution, however, may not be what we need now or in the future. The ability of the pastor and the current officers to accomplish all areas of ministry with a growing and changing membership is limited.

All too frequently, visitors and new members don't get the attention they deserve from the congregation because we have no structured plan for fellowship and evangelism. All too often, people who go ahead and do things that need doing are subject to criticism because there are no mutually agreed upon guidelines for them to follow. All too often, stewardship, education, and evangelism activities are neglected because there is no specifically defined board or committee to take responsibility for these areas. Members who do volunteer sometimes find themselves trapped in jobs that appear to never end because there is no way to pass the duty on through regularly scheduled elections.

If we continue down this path, we run the risk of becoming a congregation of one-hour-a-week "Christians". If we want to try a different path that helps more members become involved with the mission and ministry of Concordia, we must give ourselves the tools to do the job: a Constitution and By-laws which define responsibilities and jobs to be done. If, in love, we pull together and communicate, we can correct the perceived problem areas in the proposed Constitution. If you need a copy of the proposed and/or current

Constitution, please let me know. If any group would like to have a discussion session, I would be glad to help.

Friends of Concordia: the Sunday School has made very good use of the Library these past eight months. Adults have also found some topic, videos, and books helpful or entertaining to them.



JESUS LIVES!

U.S. News & World Report (April 16, 1990) did a cover story on "The Last Days of Jesus." The article points out that some believe the term "resurrection" to be a metaphor used by early Christians for whom Jesus' resurrection had occurred "in their hearts and minds." In other words, Jesus did not physically come back to life.

But then the article says, "Yet even the most skeptical Biblical scholars concede that something extraordinary happened in Jerusalem after Good Friday to account for the radical change in

the behavior of the disciples, who at Jesus' arrest had fled to their own homes in fear. Could Jesus' resurrection account for the fact that within a few weeks they were boldly preaching their message to the very people who had sought to crush them?"

We would respond, "Indeed it could!" Where do we find our confidence for living and serving? Our wisdom and skills only take us a short way. Our "good" intentions (planted in us by God) only take us so far. Our confidence for living and serving comes from the risen Lord Jesus Christ!

When Ed Marinaro was a rookie with the Minnesota Vikings, he was asked if it felt good learning to play fullback behind the great Bill Brown. With confidence he answered in the affirmative, "Between Bill Brown and me we have twenty-one years of experience in the National Football League."

Where do we find the confidence to fulfill our calling as God's people to love and serve him by loving and serving those around us? The risen Christ is in us, and we are living by his power. He isn't just risen "in our hearts and minds," but he is physically alive and running this universe on behalf of his people. We serve a living Savior! And we can be sure that between us and our Savior, we have the ability and the confidence to be faithful to our calling and faithful to our Lord.
