

Ash Wednesday is February 13, marking the start of the season of Lent in the Church Year calendar. (See Pastor Norm's article for the meaning of Lent.) The Lutheran Church has traditionally observed this season with special evening services. The theme of the services this year will be "Thoughts Along The Way." This will be an opportunity to hear what different people might have been thinking during the week of our Lord's Passion.

WHAT IS LENT?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 13th! But what's Lent, you say? If you are not sure, let me explain. Lent is a season of the Church Year which has its roots in the life of the Early Church. It evolved into a 40-day period (new ounting Sundays) before Easter, and was a time of fasting and a piritual preparation. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and reaches its joyful climax on the Festival of the Lord's Resurrection. The Early Church used Lent as a time of instruction for new converts who were baptized before dawn on Easter morning. It still carries a sense of preparation, as God's people use this time to prepare for the events of Holy Week and Easter. Lent is a penitential season; it's color is purple. We "bury" the "Alleluia" during Lent and refrain from using it until we gather to celebrate our Lord's resurrection on Easter morning. Lent is a time devoted to studying God's Word and reflecting on the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus for us. I invite you to participate in our special worship opportunities this Lenten season and to ponder the depth of God's love for you.

Congratulations to Harold Baldwin and Carol Werner who were recently married at Concordia. May the Lord bless this new




