Bible-Times Market Place



Editor's Corner

Citizenship

Because I received my property tax valuation this month, and last month income taxes were due, I have been thinking about taxation. The government (inclusive of Federal, state and local governments) taxes property which it does not own, income which it does not produce, and inheritances which it did not leave. The government taxes sales which it did not generate, and capital gains on investments that it did not make. It taxes gasoline which it does not refine, tobacco which it does not grow, and liquor that it does not distill. The government taxes labor (FICA and Medicare), though it does not perform the work that is taxed. There are many other taxes that the government levies on goods it does not own or services it does not perform. Although we might argue that there are too many taxes at rates that are too high, we would all admit that some level of taxation is necessary to live in a civilized society. We pay our taxes either because of a sense of duty or fear of the IRS and other government agencies and count ourselves good citizens for doing so.

God does not tax property though all the earth is His. He does not tax inheritances even though all we have is a gift from Him. He does not tax our labor which we do with the strength and intelligence that He has given us. God asks for no tax on gasoline, nor on liquor, nor tobacco. He does ask us to respond to His love by supporting His church and ministries which He instituted for our good. He asks us to return to Him a portion of the income He has given us. There is no HRS (Heavenly Revenue Service); He trusts us to obey out of love and gratitude for all that He has done for us.

The commandment to tithe is a part of the Old Testament Law. The people were commanded to give 10% of the yearly increase (or income) to God. I believe the commandment to tithe (10%) applies to Christians today. Not everyone shares my view, many church leaders believe that we are no longer bound by this law. God asked the Israelites who lived in a nearly subsistence economy to set aside 10% of their livelihood. We have been given so much more than the believers of the Old Testament, even if we are not bound by the law of the tithe, shouldn't it set a standard for our giving? Certainly if the Gospel has modified the law of the tithe it has not reduced our obligation to God: "Everyone to whom much is given, of him will much be required" Luke 12:48.

We are citizens of God's Kingdom by grace and mercy and nothing can change that. The privilege of citizenship in our Lord's Kingdom carries the obligation to help support and build that Kingdom with our resources and our service.
