


### Christmas Cupboard (A Bazaar)

There are only two more workshops before the Bazaar - we need all the help we can get, so plan to come Wednesday November 6th at 1:00 pm or 7:00 pm.


#### Thanksgiving Evening

#### Wake Up!

As the old world of humanistic statism crumbles around us, the major question is, what will take its place? Will it be generations of barbarism, as some think, or will it be a Christian society? What we get depends on our faithfulness to the Lord.

Of late, more than one very fine pastor has said to me that their church finances are very bad. I could add that our own (Chalcedon's) income leaves us struggling seriously.

The future will be what Christians decide it shall be. The tithe is God's required rent for living on His property; a gift to the Lord is whatever we give beyond the tithe.

Will the great Landlord of all creation take kindly to deadbeats who will not pay their rent? Will He, in the coming times of judgement, bless them, or curse them? Nobody, not even God, loves a deadbeat!

The Lord leaves it to you to decide the Christian ministries which are faithful and should be supported. We have a world to conquer, and it cannot be done unless we support God's <u>faithful</u> ministries.

What kind of world do you want for your children and grandchildren to live in? Doesn't it matter to you? Since the latter 1970s, I have been an expert witness in many religious freedom trials, almost always before an empty court-room. None turn out sometimes to give moral support to a persecuted pastor or parents.

It is time for Christians to wake up and pay up.


