### **Mission Statements**

Every church <u>must</u> have a mission statement. A mission statement tells the members and visitors alike what a particular church is about, and how that church plans to do what they are called to do.

A mission statement also tells others what this particular church does and who we do it for. As such, our statement must

be known and understood by every confirmed person in our congregation. If the mission statement isn't understood by those who are to implement it, it is only words on paper. There must be clear goals in place stating how the mission will be implemented. There should be short, medium and long range goals in place. If people don't understand how the mission will be accomplished, that is, if they don't understand the goals and why they are there - the work won't get done and the goals won't be met.

Any mission statement should be short and to the point. Two sentences at most. The statement should be on the letterhead, the bulletins and posted on signs in strategic places throughout the church building.

When asked by a visitor any member should be able to state the mission of their church, after all it is a statement of why a particular church exists. If their is no reason to exist other than meeting together on Sundays that church will never really grow.

As individuals are members of the body, so too, can congregations be described. It is my belief that God calls congregations to serve a specific function just as individuals are called to serve a specific function as part of the Body of Christ. What function is Concordia called to fulfill? Does every confirmed member know that function?

If the members don't know or understand what the mission of the church is, how will they ever hope to reach it?

Let us start the new church year off by thinking about what Concordia is specifically called by God to do and then make it your goal to do just that. It would be good to have your mission statement in place before the arrival of your new pastor, that way you can all get off on the right foot together.
