Editor's Corner

Dirty Feet

Jesus "girded himself with a towel. Then He poured water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded." (John 13:4,5) "When He had washed their feet, and taken His garments and resumed His place He said to them, 'Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for so I am. If then I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." "John 13:12-15.

The problem is that the supply of dirty feet has virtually evaporated! With paved roads and the absence of open sandals feet just don't get as dirty as they used to. With the advent of indoor plumbing, most people bathe daily. It's quite difficult to find a pair of really dirty feet now.

How then does a Christian follow our Lord's command? The obvious point of the passage is that if Jesus, the only Son of God, Lord of Lords and King of Kings, was willing to do such a humble task, there is no task too humble for us to do in His name. Every task done for Him, no matter how humble or seemingly insignificant, is consecrated by our Lord and has it's reward. "And whoever gives to one of these little ones even a cup of cold water because he is my disciple, truly, I say to you, he shall not lose his reward." Matthew 10:42.

To help fill the void of the lack of dirty feet, the Trustees and the Stewardship Committee are recommending that all church members share in the cleaning of the church. There are about 25 families or individuals now on the cleaning schedule. The new proposal, which will be voted on in February's voters' meeting, would utilize these 25 as 'cleaning captains' and assign another pair of families to clean with them. Approximately twice a year each team of three families/individuals would be asked to clean the church. They would divide the work up among themselves.

I believe that members voluntarily cleaning the church is a good witness to visitors and I have heard visitors comment that they were impressed by this. It is important to show the world that we consider serving Christ a noble calling and important job even in doing a humble task. Cleaning the church is a necessary, albeit mundane task, but the cheerful performance of such ordinary jobs gain a significance and importance far beyond the measure of the task itself, when done to the glory of God. Therefore, I ask for your support of this proposal.

I would like to point out that Jesus did not call Mary and Martha, and Mary Magdalene together to instruct them to wash each others feet, but this lesson was given to His twelve disciples, all men. Although the Lords instructions certainly apply to women as well, we men cannot evade the call to serve by saying that cleaning is women's work. We are all called to serve, and in serving we will experience the joy of the Lord.

"It's About Time"



"Good grief! Look at the time!" "Where did all of the time go?" "Well, it's about time you got here." "I've been waiting a long time." "I'm sorry I can't help you. I don't have time." I don't have time - I don't have time.

In our fast-paced world we never seem to have enough time. There never

seems to be enough time to do the things we know we should do. But on the other hand we ALWAYS seem to have enough time to do many of the things we want to do.

We can always make enough time to take in a good movie, go shopping, visit friends, read a best-selling book, or any number of other things. But there never seems to be enough time to really read and study the Bible every day. There never seems to be enough time to have daily devotions with the rest of the family. We have a hard time finding enough time to be together as a family, let alone have devotions together.

Often I've heard people say, "It's not the quantity of time I spend with the kids, it's the quality." That's pure BALONEY!!! Don't fall victim of believing that for one minute. The time with your family can't have any quality if you never give them a large enough quantity.

Our God doesn't ever deny us a quality time by restricting the amount of time we can spend with him. He is always ready to spend his time with us. He never decides that he has better things to do with his time than to let us bother him with unimportant requests for things we don't really need. He doesn't ever get tired of hearing us ask him for help. And he never gets tired of hearing us thank him. Our Father is always willing to listen to every request, big or small, but like a good Father he doesn't promise anything that would be bad for us.

In times of trouble our Father is always there to support us. The Psalmist hit the nail on the head. "The salvation of the righteous comes from the Lord; he is their stronghold in time of trouble" (Psalm 37:39) We never need to fear that we will be abandoned simply because we're having some problems in our life, no matter how ugly or terrible those problems may be.

Church Cleaning, A Proposed Change

Currently there is a problem getting the church cleaned on a regular basis. The number of members volunteering to clean has steadily been decreasing. At times those who have signed up to clean have forgotten to do so. Some are burning out because of the frequency that they are asked to clean. This problem has been discussed at the last two Voter's Meetings and the Trustees and the Stewardship Committee have been assigned the task of finding a solution.

Three alternatives were discussed: 1) Make no changes and continue with the current volunteers. 2) Hire a cleaner or a cleaning service. 3) Assign all members to a team and have twenty-six teams.

Option #1 was dropped due to the fact that it is not currently working satisfactorily. Option #2 was dropped after review of the current budget which has no excess funds available. This left option #3. This proposal will be discussed and voted on at the February Voter's Meeting.

This plan is still a voluntary system in that there is no intention to try to force people to clean. Some people may ask to have their names removed from the list and their wishes will be honored. Obviously, if too many people do this the plan will have failed, but it is hoped that most members will not find the job of cleaning twice a year too onerous.

On the next page is a proposed list of cleaners. People who are probably not physically able to clean have been left off the list intentionally. Other people may have been left off inadvertently. This list will certainly need some adjustment and is intended only as a starting point.

The Trustees and the Stewardship Committee welcome suggestions or new ideas.
