
Morning Star



grass, green leaves, flowers and everything else that comes with spring.


With the coming of spring comes a feeling of renewal. As much as I like the summer and fall seasons and the glistening



Dear Fellow Members of Concordia,

A new cleaning schedule was approved by the voters at the February Voter's meeting. The plan that was adopted was recommended by the Trustees and the Stewardship Committee, and asks that all church members share in the cleaning of the church. There are about 24 families or individuals now on the cleaning schedule. The new plan utilizes these 24 as 'cleaning captains' and assign another pair of families to clean with them. Approximately twice a year each team of three families/individuals are being asked to clean the church. They would divide the work up among themselves.

Every task done for Jesus, no matter how humble or seemingly insignificant, is consecrated by our Lord and has it's reward. "And whoever gives to one of these little ones even a cup of cold water because he is my disciple, truly, I say to you, he shall not lose his reward." Matthew 10:42.

We believe that members voluntarily cleaning the church is a good witness to visitors and visitors have commented that they were impressed by this. It is important to show the world that we consider serving Christ a noble calling and an important job even in doing a humble task. Cleaning the church is a neces-

sary, albeit mundane task, but the cheerful performance of such ordinary jobs gain a significance and importance far beyond the measure of the task itself, when done to the glory of God. Therefore, we ask for your support for the new cleaning schedule.

Although it is hoped that this will be welcomed by all as a chance to serve our Lord, this is still a voluntary system; there will be no effort to force anyone to participate. You may ask to have your name removed from the cleaning list, but we would ask you to reconsider before asking to have your name removed. Removing your name will increase the burden of your fellow members, but if you feel that you cannot help, please ask the Trustees to remove your name. The Trustees are planning on compiling a list of people that individual members could hire to take their place. Any suggestions along this line are quite welcome.

Duties of the Cleaners

Cleaning supplies are in the pantry (the supply room behind the kitchen). There are supplies for the sinks, the bathrooms, sacristies and coffee bar. When supplies run low please write the needed items on the list in the pantry.

If you need a key to the church please call Bert Svendsen 879-7028.

Set the heat for Sunday morning if you clean after noon on Saturday. Only the red lever on the thermostats should be moved to 68 degrees. If you clean before noon Saturday, call a Trustee (Clair Erickson, Bert Svendsen, Doug Warner or Ivy Nelson so they can take care of the heat. Check the thermostats on both floors to make sure they are set. This way, we won't have any cold Sunday mornings.

- 1) Vacuum the carpet, dust the woodwork (furniture, sills, pews), and dust heat registers in all rooms.
- Clean sinks, toilets and mirrors in the bathrooms, sacristies, and coffee bar. Empty the wastebaskets.
- Check the communion and visitor cards in the pews. Extras are in the sacristy vanity in the lower left-hand drawer.

Down

- 1) Sweep and/or mop the floor in all rooms.
- 2) Dust/clean/vacuum the Sunday School rooms and library as needed.
- 3) Kitchen: sweep the floor, wipe the counters, and straighten up.
- 4) Bathroom: clean sinks, toilets, and mirror.
