



### The Origins of Freedom

We often forget the origins of our freedom, and we even forget once common freedoms. In the Bible, there is no tax on land because "the earth is the Lord's, and the fulness thereof;



the world and they that dwell therein" (Ps. 24:1). With the fall of Rome, the land tax disappeared in Christendom. It returned with the rise of statism, which saw people as subjects, or, at best, citizens, <u>not</u> the people of God. Louis XIV, in ordering the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, had his dragoons billeted in Protestant homes, and "They had orders to behave badly, and pro-

ceeded to beat, torture, rob, rape, and burn their hosts" (Diana de Marly: Louis XIV and Versailles, p57, 1987.)

When James Otis said to the British, "A man's home is his castle," and when people <u>insisted</u> that the Bill of Rights <u>ban</u> the quartering of troops in homes (Boston had experienced this), they had the Huguenot experience and Biblical law in mind.

What has happened since? We have a land tax, income tax, and much, much more. Some people are for fighting to regain lost liberties, i.e., tax protests, demonstrations, agitation, and more.

Such activity is <u>folly</u>. Our laws have changed because our faith has waned or changed. Envy has replaced faith and tithing. We have made politics rather than the responsibility and faith of Christian man central. We look to Washington D.C. (God have mercy on us!) rather than to Christ our King. Politics has it's place in our world, <u>under the Lord</u>, which is where we all belong.
