

Lord, help me to see the conditions in which my brothers and sisters


Help me to hear the cry of the anguished, the whisper of the hopeless, and the plea of the forgotten.

AGAINST HUNGER The Lutheran
Church Missouri Synod has many mission/
preaching stations throughout Africa. The

central-western coastal region of this great continent has been very fruitful for our church historically. In the small western coastal nation of TOGO we have a congregation of approximately 400 souls. Togo is a country of great natural beauty and a land of many peoples. This land has also been plagued by severe drought, famine and natural disaster in the last decade. Like many portions of Africa, the people of this region are in need of immediate food assistance and medical care. The missionaries there are doing a marvelous work in spreading the life giving Word of

God. They are also being assisted by <u>Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS)</u>
<u>World Relief</u>. This organization of our church body provides humanitarian assistance both at home and abroad in times of crisis and natural disaster. Pastor Cartwright is presently running/cross country skiing 1,000 miles during the 1992 year. He is paying himself one dollar per mile for this particular cause. LCMS World Relief has committed itself to a \$10,000 grant to aid this nation this year.

The assistance will be managed by on sight missionaries and staff. If you would like to sponsor him, or give privately to this cause our congregation has

set up a special "TOGO-AFRICAN DISASTER" fund.

The Cartwrights are giving to this cause over and above their present support of Concordia's ministry here in Steamboat. Just last week our Sunday School staffidentified "TOGO" as the target for their first quarter offerings. We are people of means giving to assist people in need. Perhaps, we can dream a bit together as to how we can give to this need. Who knows, we may even be able to reach the \$10,000 dollar figure? Check the mobile bulletin board for further detail regarding this project.

Also, look for a special winter cross country skiing event that will <u>TAR-GETTOGO</u>. Please pray for the people of Togo. Pray for the missionaries that are laboring there. Pray for your involvement. May the Lord Jesus guide us in this good work that he has prepared for us to step into.
