

FROM THE PASTOR


To the Members and Friends of Concordia: Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior! Vaclav Havel writes: "I am not an optimist, because I am not sure that everything ends well. Nor am I a pessimist, because I am not sure that



everything ends badly. <u>I just</u> carry hope in my heart. Hope is a feeling that life and work have meaning. You either have it or you don't, regardless of the state of the world that surrounds you. Life without hope is an empty, boring

and useless life. I cannot imagine that I could strive for something if I did not carry hope in me. I am thankful to God for this gift. It is a gift as life itself." Many times I have returned to this particular quote. I cannot even remember where I found this paragraph. It has been pinned to my bulletin boards. It has found a home in my wallet. It has been stuck in my Bible. It has shown up on my refrigerator and it has been stuck to the dashboard in my cars. It is my personal belief, an extension of the gift of faith, that life does have hope and purpose. True meaning for life is centered in the person and work of Jesus Christ. 

NEW IDEAS FOR THE FAMILY FOR THE NEW YEAR!

Here are six ideas you can use with your family in the coming year. Take the suggestions and modify them to fit your family's needs. Have fun!

- 1. <u>SOMETHING SPECIAL</u>: Have each member prepare for a family meeting, share time. Each member of the family will think of something special to share with the other members of a the family at a designated "talk time." (e.g., newspaper clipping, a photograph, Bible passage, an object, etc.) This activity will validate your child's feelings regarding something that is personally meaningful to them.
- 2. <u>THE FAMILY PHOTO ALBUM</u>: Choose photographs that share insights into the family, or give insight to the family history.
- 3. <u>PARENTS AS CHILDREN</u>: Children are usually very interested in what their parents were like when they were children. Share parts of your earlier life with your children by recalling early events. (e.g., favorite teacher, first date, best friend, what got you in trouble, what you did for entertainment.)
- 4. <u>BIG QUESTIONS</u>: Family members take turns answering any or all of the following questions: A) What is the nicest thing anyone has done for you? B) Who is the person outside the family you admire most? C) What is the most difficult thing in life for you now? D) What have you done that you're most proud of?
- 5. THE FAMILY OLYMPICS: Friendly competition. Everyone in the family must choose one event that all will compete in. Here are some examples: A) Skipping rope. B) Saying a tongue twister. C) Naming animals that begin with each letter of the alphabet. D) Balancing a stack of pennies. E) Memorizing a series of numbers. F) Playing croquet.
- 6. JAR OF FUN: Place in a jar note cards of fun things for your family to do, and pick a note card from the jar whenever you have time together. You may want to use different colored note cards for outside activities and inside activities, or activities which cost a little money and activities that cost nothing, etc.. Replenish the jar with new activities, so that the jar is always full.
