FOLLOWING HIM

Growing Straight and Strong in the Lord

Daily devotions around God's Word make for stronger faith and stronger families.

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Just as forest trees can grow under the proper conditions, so, too, can people thrive spiritually given the right protection and nourishment. Often, these essential commodities-protection and nourishment-are best found in the Christian home, where the faith of family members, planted at Baptism by the Holy Spirit, can thrive and grow.

Yet, even in Christian homes, enemies may abound. So much today vies for the attentions of our families. Indeed, some of these forces may of us. even attack the family and the Christian values it holds dear. But God protects and nourishes those who take refuge in His love.

Impressing the love of God upon our children requires a diligent kind of teaching-one that goes beyond casual conversation to deliberate action.

A special time set aside for family devotions provides an avenue for such teaching. Through family devotions, faith grows as each person learns more about God in His Word. Family relationships are strengthened as feelings are shared. trust is built and prayers are offered. Priorities and values are taught and future problems averted. Having family



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The key is to find a time that suits the schedules of the most people. (Some compromising may be necessary to find a time that's agreeable and workable for all.) Many families find the morning to be the best time. For one reason, the early morning hours may present relatively few scheduling conflicts; for another, families find that morning devotions set a nice tone for the rest of the day. Even those who aren't necessarily early risers may horrible as they thought.

Other families use the time right after supper (prior, even, to dessert), before the evening's activities scatter the group. There's time at this juncture to relax, enjoy each other's company, and develop the devotion's theme through activities and discussion. If company comes, encourage them to join you.

Bedtime is also a natural time for reflecting on the events of the day. But if people-particularly the children-are tired or cranky, another time would obviously be better.

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Involve everyone in the devotions to keep interest high. Everyone can participate in some way, from reading Bible verses and offering prayer requests to distributing hymnals and singing songs. Toddlers may need to be given something to look at or play with during part of the session, but they still can be present. Sometimes, just cuddling into someone's lap is enough to calm the restless ones. Soon they will learn the significance of this special family time and treasure their part in it.

If there is a wide range of ages among the children, encourage the older ones to devise activities that will include and appeal to their younger siblings. Even if there are no little children, planning the devotion is a good way to involve older children who may view family devotions as a boring obligation. Let them choose the topics, songs and materials and take their turns at leading.

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

Take a moment to express on paper your love and affections for your wife and children. The simple act of writing them down carries impact for two important reasons:


- 1) Writing down your thoughts proves that you're thinking of your family at a time and place when they weren't in your presence. (Wives and children like to know they're in our thoughts even when we're apart.)
- 2) Written expressions of love can be saved or displayed and reread many times. They become a wonderful way of documenting the continuity and depth of a love relationship.

To help get you started, here are some themes that you can easily adapt to your purposes: Praising character strengths, appreciating things done for you especially routine tasks, praising important roles or commitments, admiring consistency, or praising service to others.
