



MISSIONS

The LWML (Concordia's Women Guild) will be including information on one or two of Concordia's Mission Projects in each monthly newsletter. This month we will focus on The Good Shepherd Lutheran Home of the West. Good Shepherd Lutheran Home of the West provides Christ- centered residential training and supervision in Denver and Ft. Collins for over 70 adults who are mentally retarded. Residents occupy group homes, apartments, and one main facility, which is subdivided into 3 living areas. Good Shepherd was organized in Anaheim, California on September 9, 1951. Altogether there are a total of 131 living units in the six regions served by Good Shepherd. Through our rummage sales and Bazaar we are able to give Good Shepherd of the West \$1,700 this year. We pray that you as Concordia's members will participate in our rummage sale again this May in order that we may continue to support this wonderful ministry.

In addition to the cash donation the Good Shepherd Home is also grateful to receive the following items (which you may donate by contacting Doris Riewe): Dish Towels, beach towels, bath towels, hand towels, wash cloths, and tablecloths. Sheets twin fitted bottoms, flat tops. Paper products. Terrycloth shirts/ fronts. Toilet articles: toothpaste, toothbrushes soft bristle, shave lotions, roll-on deodorants, suntan screens, fingernail care kits, bar soaps, shampoos, hand lotions. To appreciate how it is more blessed to give than to receive, it helps to know a little something about the hard of hearing. This is a condition which my dear wife, and for that matter the children too, have been accusing their dad of, of late. Keep in mind that my family is comprised of all women ... even the two dogs, the cat, and although uncertain, we suspect, so too, the canary. So while there may be some measure of the biblical enmity between thee (me) and the woman (them) going on, I admit to hearing much better when wearing my spectacles. This in all probability is because I can see the speakers lips shaping the words. Acknowledging the premise that the 'ole hearing acuity is starting to go, I admit to a further observation, which is, that as a matter of pride, there are only so many times that I'm willing to risk saying "what?" Options are limited ...you do or don't connect, you fake it, drop it, or try again.

One of the pastor's recent sermons spoke about a journey of faith. The challenge was made to leave the safe places where we spend our time and go out into those sometimes unsafe places where God's people need to be. One such place may be the extended care center. It's almost human nature to be afraid of hospitals, which is sort of what the center seems to be. Perhaps its the "... there but for the grace of God go I ..." syndrome that makes us shy away from the "old peoples home." Then again, maybe we feel threatened because we don't know what to say or how to act ... its not safe when we're not in control. I've felt all of these emotions and often still do.

Yet, to share a Sunday devotion with the

residents at the extended care center, the risk is made worthwhile. While we all can't sing like angels or preach like Paul, we can say the Lord's prayer together, sing a hymn, receive the benediction. We can, by our very presence, make a statement that says "you are cared for, you are loved, you are important enough to spend time with."

I was reminded again of this fact during the February visit while speaking with one of the residents I've come to know. Kathryn used to live in Kremmling, play the organ in her church, her kids live out of state, and her health has been noticeably failing.

She said, "I need your prayers."
My bumbling reply, "We all do."
She said, "What?"
A little louder, "We all do."

Louder still, "We all do." (What a dumb answer on my part, this wasn't


