

#### On Riches

Christ never said money or material things were problems. He said that they were symptoms of the real problems. He constantly warned us to guard our "hearts" against greed, covetousness, ego, and pride, because these are the tools that Satan uses to control and manipulate this world. Christ warned us a great deal more about materialism than He did any other sin. "And He said to them, "Beware, and be on your guard against every form of greed; for not even when one has an abundance does his life consist of his possessions" (Luke 12:15). In fact, in the parable about salvation in Matthew 13:18-23, "the deceitfulness of riches" is given as a cause for unfruitfulness. Satan has taken the very riches provided by God to enhance our lives and bring others to salvation and has diverted them for his use. Today, even Christians evaluate (or value) others on the basis of how much they have and how successful they are in worldly terms. The

poor are thought to be losers—less spiritual than the winners. ### Ten assimilation steps

St. Peter, Macomb, Mich., located in a rapidly growing area, averages 60 visitors every week. Some of these are repeat visitors who wish to become members of our adult confirmation class.

The assimilation committee conducts the following program:

- 1. An orientation class for all who wish to become members.
- 2. Orientation includes getting acquainted; a spiritual gifts analysis; an opportunities for involvement survey; expectations and procedures for new members in the area of worship, communion attendance, Bible study, fellowship, giving and service; and a tour of the church and school.
- 3. At a welcome service, new members receive a flower to wear, are welcomed during the service and receive a certificate of membership. Individual and group pictures are taken.
- 4. A potluck meal is served immediately after the welcome service. The new members are welcomed by board and organization leaders and receive a new member packet. The packet contains a pictorial directory, church telephone directory, list of organizations and leaders, Portals of Prayer, Michigan Lutheran, the church newsletter, a cross from AAL, the church constitution and similar materials.
- 5. The new members are introduced to the congregation through bulletin inserts that feature the new member's picture and some interesting information about that person.
- 6. New members are provided with sponsors by the sponsor subcommittee.

- 7. The records subcommittee keeps all the data regarding spiritual gifts and areas of interest in service.
- 8. Other subcommittees attempt to help boards, organizations and staff get the new member involved in an area where he or she expressed interest in serving.
- 9. The new members are asked to complete a questionnaire about their assimilation into our church.
- 10. At this point, the orientation of new members is working smoothly. Much more work needs to be done in the follow-up area of getting them involved in serving, Bible class and discipleship. We also are working on more intentional evangelism efforts through canvasing and follow-up calls.



At St. Peter, Macomb, Mich., 18 adults were confirmed and seven received by professions of faith.



## Who is my neighbor?

Trinity, Lake George, Fla., encourages all its members to think of neighbors "as those around us who have not been given forth in Christ or are living without a church home." It's an "all-inthe-neighborhood" outreach theme, inviting neighbors to one's home and then to church.

The congregation credits its 10 percent a year growth to being neighbors to all neighbors in the area. Pastor Gary Rehborg tells us that the excitement builds as new members especially bring their neighbors.

### Four factors are critical for growth

Pastor Stephen Mueller of St. Paul, Junction City, Wis., lists four critical factors for growth in the congregation:

- 1. Visit all guests at worship within 48 hours.
- 2. Friendship evangelism.
- 3. People are invited to become involved in activities before they join.
- 4. Pastor with a vision (always asking for names of possible contacts, present at local public school and on its field trips, chaplain for the fire department, etc.) of caring about people.
