By selling our homemade cross necklaces we have raised over one hundred dollars towards our Confirmation Retreat which we hope to arrange for the month of May.





4. If you are "unchurched" you are invited to join our New Members' class.


Our congregation will receive new members on the last Sunday of January. That is our Friendship Sunday.
