
Properly preaching the Gospel

- 11. When all I hear as a worshiper is the damning sins of the unbelieving world and not about the pastor's sins and my own.
- 12. When I, as a worshiper, am still burdened with my failed responsibility and its fruits.
- 13. When the Gospel is preached with conditions attached.
- 14. When man is in anyway involved in the Gospel.

(The truth is that the Gospel always refers alone to God's doing the Law to man's not doing.)

- 15. When too much stress is put on my faith, and I as a Christian am asked to flee to my faith instead of Christ.
- 16. When the pastor does not let the Gospel transcend all my failures, guilt, despair, etc.



EMOTIONAL RELIGION

Sometimes I get emotional about religion. Not in the usual sense, though. I get emotional about religion because of the abuses I see connected with what could be termed "emotional religion."

A recent poll taken by the Gordon S. Black Corporation for the newspaper *USA Today* found that a large number of people are religious because "it feels good." A whopping 26 percent of those polled go to church "for pleasure." That disturbs me. Don't get me wrong. I would hope that you derive some pleasure from your worship, and I'm certainly not against "feeling good." But when that becomes the chief end of religion, I am concerned.

There are many groups in the religious marketplace that emphasize *feeling* over what I would call the "objective." They point to what you feel rather than what is. Historic Christianity stands in radical opposition to that kind of thing (or perhaps I should call it "feeling").

Take the events of Easter, for example: Christ's death and resurrection. Our feeling about such things has nothing whatsoever to do with what these two events have accomplished for us. Our feeling does not in the least affect our salvation. What Christ did on the cross and what His resurrection means lie completely outside of our feelings. Our feelings had nothing to do with these events occurring.

Our feelings do not validate our faith, no matter what some people might say. Christ's death on the cross has earned forgiveness for the world, whether the world believes it or not, whether the world accepts it or not. It is an objective fact! Christ's resurrection from the dead on the third day has nothing whatsoever to do with what I feel. He rose, independent of what or how I feel about it.

There is much comfort to be derived from these facts. First, our salvation doesn't depend on us, least of all, our feelings. There are days when I simply don't feel forgiven or like God's child; sometimes I don't feel like the saint that I am by virtue of Christ's work; and the day-to-day grind can get me down so that I forget the fact that heaven is assured by my Lord's resurrection. Thus, I can be happy that my faith doesn't rest upon my feelings, but upon the bedrock of Christ's death and resurrection—two objective facts. That's also why Christians can be called "an Easter people," because we really are raised up—even when our feelings betray us.

So, I can get pretty emotional about emotional religion. I don't like it when I hear that feelings are more important than facts. But I'll take quiet satisfaction in knowing that our faith rests upon Christ and Christ alone.
