#### To the Members and Friends of Concordia:

Greetings in the name of our risen Lord!

"Last year our house burned down. I lost my cat. We lost it all. The Red Cross made sure I had a pair of boots for the winter."

The above comments were shared by a couple of young men who made the trip to Glorieta (Santa Fe, NM) with our youth group. They shared these realities during one of our devotion times. These two guys are spending the summer with their mother who worships regularly here at Concordia.

One of the Psalms prompted the comments. I do believe that we were discussing the constant care of a good God. We were talking about how easy it is to get focused in on "things." Things go away. Things change. Things fall apart. Things break. Things rust. Things die. Things fail. Things.....!

"..As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever!"

That's what we were discussing..."forever." These guys shared the reality that things change, but God does not. Life has an eternal dimension. We need to see beyond things. A house of ashes brought this reality home to these guys and to us.

God is the only real "eternal" thing. In order for us to receive eternal life...we have to be connected to Jesus and the forgiveness He offers us. Forgiveness from Calvary's cross and the open tomb gives us eternity...with God!

It was a good trip with the young people in our church. I wish you all could have gone. Maybe next year. Maybe the following year. Maybe...? We have an eternity to decide.

#### What is God Like?

Thinking deeply about God is difficult, and at times, confusing. This is cuased by our human limitations. You could think that God exists, and that God is responsible for our human existence, and still not believe in the God whom Jesus called his Father. Sometimes people's sickness, accidents, financial losses, death, and the tragedies they see affect how they think about God. These people begin to blame God for their troubles, and they decide that he is not kind and loving. They conclude that if God creates or even permits such trouble he must be monstrous and hateful.

Certainly, there is no simple answer to justify the kinds of troubles that cause people to think of God that way. Who could ever say, for example, that an automobile accident is God's doing? Who could say that crippled and helpless accident victims are an expression of the loving will of the heavenly Father? Christians pause in the face of such terrible things and admit that they do not understand them. But they also refuse to blame God for those evils.

Christians remain convinced that God is good. They look about them, and on the basis of their own experience see beauty and love in the world. They consider all the provisions they believe God has made for their welfare. They are certain, because of these things, that God loves them.

In the minds of Christians God's love is reinforced by Jesus. They believe that God sent Jesus to the world because of his love for them. They know that Jesus even accepted death on the cross as an expression of that love. These words of John's Gospel express this belief: "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may...have eternal life" (3:16)

The Bible and the church say that God is love. What does that mean?
