
LWML


Our current budget is being met very well by the gift of treasure by our growing membership. However, per member gifts of treasure have declined.


And so we know and rely on the love God has for us.

- 4. Invite a young person to do something you enjoy doing together (play a game, go to a park, go to a movie, etc.).
- 5. Have an open-door policy in your neighborhood so kids feel welcome in your home for refreshments, conversation, or just hanging out.

FAMILY ISSUES

Below is an excerpt taken from the book, Quiet Times for Parents, by H. Norman Wright

Fathers, do not irritate and provoke your children to anger (do not exasperate them to resentment), but rear them (tenderly) in the training and discipline and the counsel and admonition of the Lord. (Ephesians 6:4, AMP)

It's all too easy for children to find their identity wrapped up in performance and appearance. Why? Largely because those are the values their parents and teachers reinforce. Children are applauded if they're cute, if they get straight As, if they say funny jokes, or if they hit home runs. Thanks to the adults in their lives, it doesn't take long for children to internalize and begin to live by three unhealthy principles:

- 1. If I am physically attractive and others admire me, I will be special.
- 2. If I perform well and accomplish great things, I will be accepted.
- 3. If I obtain social status and others recognize me, I will be significant.

But what about the child who isn't cute or entertaining? What about the child who never wins a starring role in the school play or strikes out most of the time in baseball? Tragically, children like these are often compared, rejected, or ignored by the adults in their lives - including their own parents! They begin to question their identity

and doubt their worth. The false values our society promotes can even pervade our Christian homes.

What about you? Children may struggle with identity and self-acceptance because their parents struggle with the same issues. Children who grow up with a false basis for identity and acceptance don't automatically grow out of it when they reach adulthood. As adults they continue to base their identity on these three shaky pillars. They also tend to perpetuate them in their children.

If you are going to help your children realize their identity and acceptance in Christ, lead the way by doing so in your own life. You'll find a better life for yourself in doing so!

In, with, and under the bread and wine of the Lord's Table are the very body and blood of Jesus Christ.

Concordia has established the following guidelines to encourage you to come to the Lord's Table.


- 1. Young people who have been instructed in God's good and guiding Word regarding the truths of the Communion Table are invited to come and receive this real gift of God's grace. Our congregation offers instruction and preparation for the Lord's Table during 7th and 8th grade Confirmation instruction.
- 2. Some young people have prepared for the Lord's Table at an earlier age due to guidance received in another congregation. Those young people are welcome at the Lord's Table here at Concordia.
- 3. Because of the truths present in God's word, Concordia believes that Jesus' body and blood are miraculously present in the bread and wine. Jesus himself said, "This is my body...This is my blood."
- 4. We are guided by God's Word when it states that a person needs to examine themselves prior to coming to the Lord's Table. This "self examination" should result in one being able to recognize the Biblical

truth of "real presence" (#3 above) as well as

the truth that the sinner needs the Savior.

5. When a person comes to the Communion feast, that individual is making a profession of faith. You profess your trust in God's gracious gift of forgiveness. You profess that you hold much in common with those you are communing with.

Please fill out the Communion registration cards on Communion Sundays and give it to an usher as you come to the table. When you come to the Table, come knowing God's grace is for you. If you are yet to be instructed feel free to come and receive a Pastoral blessing.
