Subject: Light

IN THE DARK

'Have you ever felt like you were "in the dark"?

The lights finally went back on November 10th, thirty years ago. The night before, nine states in the Northeastern U.S. experienced the greatest power failure in history.

The newspaper read, "Most traffic signals gave out; intersections jammed. Skyscraper elevators halted between floors. As of midnight, untold numbers were still trapped in them. Operating rooms went dark. Airplanes circled darkened landing strips." While most adults were paralyzed, one child would later write, "It was dark! We had popcorn in the fireplace! It was fun!"

Your Creator describes everyone who doesn't walk with him as "being in darkness." You can be in constant illumination from external sources, but if you are not wired to God through His Son, Jesus Christ, you are living in an unending spiritual power failure. The Bible says, "God is light, in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth" (1 John 1:5, 6). Jesus is the "Ultimate Power Source" that will guarantee that you will never be "in the dark" again!


ThursdayWomen's Bible Study


