As the year 2001 begins, I would like to set a challenge before each and everyone of us. The challenge is the personal increase of Bible study, privately and cooperatively. Isaiah 9:6 states, "Unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government shall be upon His shoulder and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace." This Isaiah passage, as we all know, is speaking of Jesus our Savior, coming to rule over a kingdom of people submitting to the prince's supreme authority. The light has come! Epiphany!



#### CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE






