





How many of you have had experience dealing with addictions? It is a prevalent issue in today's "gratify me now" society. The easier it is to feel different, the more people will take advantage of this convenience. Paul says, "Our people must learn to devote themselves to doing what is good, in order that they may provide for our daily necessities and not live unproductive lives." Titus 3:14. Addictions are a means of becoming unproductive,

and walking away from God's will. When our lives become unproductive due to an addiction, it is time to make a change.

All too often we are unable to see the slippery slope of addiction. People build a wall of denial that is very difficult to see through, and family members suffer the same limitations. 


