



Tools for Living*



Addict: A person with a habit so strong that he cannot easily give it up. devotee, fanatic, buff, enthusiast

Addiction: compulsion, dependence, need, obsession, craving, infatuation

Habit: custom, tendency, addiction, routine, practice, tradition, pattern

Recover: to regain something which was lost; to be restored to aood health

Recovery: The power to regain something, revival, regain, recuperation, mending, healing, improvement, renewal.

I looked up the meanings of these words to see if there were any definitions that I did not know. The one that really struck me was the word habit. I usually thought of a habit as bad. You hear people say, "I bit my fingernails, it is a bad habit" etc. Then there are custom and tradition—these are holidays and little things that a parent did with you, that you do with your child. It gives you a good feeling.

Then there is the word tendency. I have a tendency to eat when I am upset. When I am angry I walk away. When I want to feel good or take the edge off, I drink or take drugs. Now we are getting into a pattern, a routine of using food, avoidance, and alcohol as a way to hide our feelings and not face them. I am not hurting anyone, so what is the problem? The problem is that you are hurting yourself. Do you think that God likes to see us abusing our bodies that were a gift from Him?

We can try everything in the book to get it together. We can say we are in control and can take care of ourselves. How many times have you tried but it did not work? We need God's help in our healing.


"Many of us are just waking up to the fact that recovery is an essential part for everyone. It is the simple but challenging process of daily seeking God's will for our life instead of demanding to go our own way. Recovery is letting God do for us what we
cannot do for ourselves while also taking the steps necessary to draw closer to our
Creator and Redeemer. It is allowing God to heal our wounded soul so we can help
others in the process of healing. All of us need to take part in this process; it is an inherent part of being human."

Let us set together on the Journey towards healing and newfound strength — not strength found within ourselves, but strength found through trusting God and allowing him to direct our decisions and plans." (NLT)

A word from the Parish Administrator

A dear friend recently called me and asked, "Any grace notes there?" It was a good question because it forced me to pause and think of the good things that have happened over the past month at Concordia. I can easily get stuck in the dark places—live in the shadows of complaint and cynicism. It has been a long year without a full-time pastor and, at times, one can tend to hole up in a place of lament.

If my friend had simply asked, "How's it going?" I am certain that my answer would have sent me in another direction entirely. I may have begun with a litany of complaints about the present 'thorns in my side" or worries of the day. Thankfully, my friend was encouraging me by asking me a question which focused my thoughts on moments of grace and signs of



God's goodness in my midst. Thinking in that positive vein, there are many! God continues to shine into dark spots and give light.

Over this last month we had the opportunity to celebrate Pastor Wayne and Ruth's 40 years of fruitful ministry. What a wonderful day that was for our congregation to

review how God has acted in the lives of Pastor Wayne and Ruth. And now they continue in ministry (even in retirement!) to bless us with their guidance and presence.

We have been blessed with some wonderful music this summer. The choral group Cantata provided special music for our worship services and a concert. They sang spirituals that could knock your socks off and peaceful melodies that could help to mend a wounded soul. Several days ago there was a concert given by Justin Unger who shared his considerable musical talents and a wonderful message and witness of Christ's love for us. The list continues to grow with grace notes at Concordia.

We also had the unexpected pleasure of having Thomas Conroy, a teacher at Perry Mansfield for the summer, show up one day and say, "I was out riding and this church seems to be within biking distance so I thought I'd check it out - and, if you need an organist this summer, I'm available." Well, it just so happened that Jan Fritz was going to take a much deserved break during the summer and we were looking for someone to fill in. Rebecca Duryea commented that she used to write

two. Perhaps I need to consider more often all the grace notes in my life. Their abundance is evident if I put in a window and actually look out to see God at work in the world and in my life.

I am thankful that my friend asked me, "Any grace notes there?"

"Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things." (Phil 4:8)

Scoop from the Sup...

This is part of the scripture that we looked at in Sunday School when we were talking together as families about what is LOVE.

"I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my father, I have made known to you. You did not choose me, I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit — fruit that will last." John 15:15-16

I love this passage in the Bible. I seem to keep bumping into it! Of course it is all within the context of Christ's command for us to love each other and lay our lives down for our friends. What keeps popping out to me is that Christ calls me His friend.

Recently someone told me something important to her and she said, "I am telling you this because you are my friend." How often do you hear those words "YOU ARE MY FRIEND." 
