people are.


I suppose more and more of us will experience that as we move on in calendar years.

Being a Tourist

A word from the Parish Administrator



"Been there, done that." This might be a phrase invented by tourists who barely skimmed the surface and didn't even realize what they missed. I just came back from a vacation to California and was "the tourist" Steamboat locals so often complain about. I joined the throngs of tourists in San Francisco and had my 'must see' list so I could finally say, "Been there, done that."

Golden Gate Bridge? Check. Fisherman's Wharf? Check. Chinatown? Check.

One by one, we checked off the 'must see' sights of San Francisco but I knew that I really hadn't been there and *done* that. I had seen a few things, but I was definitely a tourist.

On the way home, we took a quick trip to Yosemite National Park and suffered the height of a drive-by tourist mentality. At the gate you are given a map of the park, and once again, all the high points are listed on the main roads. You stop, pull over and take two minutes to take a picture and climb back in the car. Ok, maybe you spend five minutes and convince the kids to pose for the camera. You know, so

you have proof that you've "been there, and done that." Of course there is the 24 minute video at the visitor center that has a quick history of the park and lots of great photography of the spectacular creation surrounding you. El Capitan is a sight to behold. I've always wanted to go to Yosemite (and I did) but what I really wanted—and what I definitely missed—was experiencing Yosemite. I have been to enough National Parks to know that there is a vast array of experiences which



await you-but which require time and perhaps some effort. The roads less traveled are the ones which draw you in and give you a sense of connectedness. It may not be the awesome 'scenic view' parking areas that leave the biggest impression. It is more likely to be the campsite where you do the work of setting up and taking down the tent and sitting around a campfire talking. It is more likely to be on the back trails where you take the time to hike in the splendor of these parks. For me, it has always been time and effort

that make me truly feel like I've *been* there and *done* that. Time and effort are what draw me in so that I feel a part of the landscape.

On the long ride home, I reflected that Concordia and a community of faith is somewhat like a grand creation set aside as a national park. There are the highlights— Christmas, Easter, Sunday Worship — but I have found. or discovered by default, that it's often on the roads less traveled in a church that one can fully appreciate a community of faith. Bible studies. committee meetings, retreats. gathering for prayers, LWML, Diners Club or working on projects are what it takes to go from being a Christian tourist to a fellow traveler in a faith community. It is the time and the effort which ultimately connects me to this church.

In a sense, I was a Christian tourist for years—hitting the highlights-but missing the vastness of what God was offering me in a community of faith. This is a big park!

I would encourage you to explore some of the roads less traveled in Concordia. You will find that you were missing something, and you will grow in faith and be fed by fellow members and the Word of God. Get out of the car.



All in need of Recovery and Healing

When Jean Smith invited anyone interested in helping with the Recovery Ministry to an informational meeting, I went because I felt this was an im-

portant and unique ministry for our church, and community. And I realized that many of my favorite people were people who were journeying through recoveries of different kinds. So I went hoping to be of help or at least to give support. It never occurred to me that it would be a help to ME.

Our Recovery Room is Christian based and not associated in anyway with Alcoholics Anonymous, but we use a 12 Step model, so those interested in becoming part of the ministry team were asked to attend at least six AA or Alanon meetings. So that's how I found myself at my first AA meeting. I was blown away by the warmth, openness, and honesty of the group. As we prayed the Serenity Prayer and read the 12 Steps I was struck by how scriptural this is. The first three steps deal with recognizing our need for God and turning our life over to Him. The next eight steps tell us how to deal openly and honestly with ourselves and each other. I thought, "These are wonderful tools that would be a help to anyone." Later, I went to an Alanon meeting. Alanon is for family, or friends who have an addicted person in their life. Like most of us, I have family members who are or have been dealing with addictions, either their own or other's. Each meeting I recognized addictive- type behaviors in my loved ones and even in myself. I discovered that even though we may have never been chemically addicted ourselves, many of us were brought up in families touched by addiction and we have learned unhealthy ways of dealing with life. More and more I came to realize how much WE ALL could use these tools.

Maybe you don't have chemical addictive people in your life, but I think you'd admit you do have broken/hurting people in your lives. After all, Scripture tells us we have all sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. Just maybe some of these tools for living might be of help to you or perhaps a help to a friend or loved one? Come check it out. On Tuesday, September 25 at 6:45 p.m., "Tools for Living" will be hosting a Panel Discussion on Recovery & Healing. Come hear your fellow members share their stories of faith as they journey through recovery. (Babysitting will be provided). Also available is the "Recovery Room" brochure located in the box on the wall just to the right as you enter the main door to the Narthex). I think you will find these tools a wonderful help in all your relationships. Come and see for yourself.
