Tenets, Tidbits and Trails . . . the Elder's report

"On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand – all other ground is sinking sand; all other ground is sinking sand." – "The Solid Rock," hymn by Edward Mote.

The Rock. Some might think of the professional wrestler with the acrobatic eyebrows. Some think of the action movie with a plot about

Alcatraz. Others think of "a rock that makes them fall." Romans 9:33, or God's refuge for His people, Psalm 94:22. To me, the Rock is both Jesus Christ, and believing in Him as the foundation of the Church, Matt 16:18. During the time of Advent, I am constantly reminded that God the Father chose to be a part of humanity in an incredibly humble way. Ironically, Jesus Christ was the most powerful being to ever walk the earth, but lived in complete humility and obedience to His Father.

I once rented a home when I was in college that had no foundation. Some people in this community might have called it "affordable housing." It was built in the early 1900's, and the exterior walls were made from adobe style clay that was finished with a wood facade. These walls were between 18 – 24 inches thick! Upon moving in I noticed that the floor of the entire home was like a funhouse. It had all kinds of depressions and bulges where the earth had contracted and expanded. I learned that prior to my arrival the master bedroom had a three foot high bulge that required cutting out the floorboards and shoveling two yards of dirt out the window to level the floor! Although the house looked fine from the outside, it was actually in terrible shape on the inside. Without picking up the house and placing a foundation underneath, it will always be in upheaval.

The birth of our King, Jesus, lifts up believers and places a rock solid foundation under them. There are many, many people who look fine on the outside, but are in upheaval and broken on the inside. Let us all be mindful of the foundation that we can help someone else attain by a kind word, a caring gesture, or by living an example of freedom. From humble beginnings to the glory of sitting at the right hand of the Father, Jesus laid a perfect foundation for us all.







The late Janis Joplin would have us believe that "freedom is another word for nothing left to lose." Rather, freedom gives us the ability to choose, and choosing unwisely can lead to great loss. God has given us freedom in Christ to choose wisely.

"It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather serve one another in love." Galatians 5:1 and 13.
