Recently, the Board members of Lift-Up of Routt County met to create a vision statement and to look toward the future. The vision statement, which is phrased to include the accomplishing of goals in the next 5 years, states: "Lift-Up is a visible, faith-based organization in partnership with a broad range of the faith, business, and professional community, with excellent personnel and facilities to accomplish all operations and programs."

Lift-Up has an expansive network of skilled volunteers and staff to provide casework, appropriate referrals, brokerage of capitol goods and services, and client education, including money management training.

Lift-Up maintains financial and operational stability through community donations, thrift store revenues, and other funding sources. Grant funds are solicited to support start-up programs, capitol expenditures, and direct financial assistance.

In the Fall of 2000, Concordia created a vision statement of sorts by listing the qualities we needed/wanted in a pastor: preaching ability, ability to equip others for ministry, ability to interact in the community, etc...

Well, we have what we wanted/needed. Maybe more. We'll save on batteries for the cordless microphone. We have the promise of Pastor Herbert's abilities and talents. But what will this mean?

We have many in our congregation who are involved in wonderful ways to God's glory. But if positions and responsibilities are simply shifted among the same people we are in trouble.

Lift-Up has a vision and a mission to reach out on behalf of the faiths it represents to help those in need -- the <u>physical</u> needs -- food, clothing, rent or utility assistance if necessary. But it is the responsibility of the faiths to minister to the spiritual needs. It is OUR responsibility given to us by Jesus to reach out to each other in this family, to the community and the world. We give out of our abundance which is wonderful but we need to give some of the other things we value the most. Something we have in limited and diminishing supply.

Take it personally.

A word from your Parish Administrator

"Don't take this personally, but..."

How often have you heard someone in a conversation with you say these words? It's a pretty good sign that whatever that person *doesn't* want you to take *personally* you will. It is our human nature to take things personally. That is meant to be a positive blessing - not a negative one.

Pastor Wayne, in one of his last sermons to Concordia as our interim pastor, stated that it was going to be personal. He also promised us that his last sermon would be professional but that this particular message would be personal. I beg to differ - I don't think he kept his promise to not be personal for his last message. I do believe it was professional. But not personal? Forget it. Pastor Wayne has always made his sermons personal. His Gospel message comes from the heart. God has worked through this man to proclaim Good News. The way he goes about doing God's work is personal because it has been ingrained into his day to day life. He takes the Gospel personally. It is evident in the way he cared for us and delivered the Gospel message to us week after week.

The sermons a pastor delivers should reflect a personal perspective. If there is no personal connection made, no evidence of the pastor's life being shaped by the words he preaches, the words will not be that effective. God's Word is meant to be taken personally. That's how it works to bring about repentance and change within us. Pastor Tim was personal. The Elders take the message personally, and they deliver it as such. Ellyn Myller proclaims Good News in a personal way. We want our Sunday School teachers to be connected to the kids they teach — to be personal.

Scott E. Herbert is our pastor now. No doubt, he will want us to take the Gospel message *personally*. Jesus wanted to reach people in a personal way. We grow as a family of faith from the individual perspectives of our different pastors. Each one unique with unique gifts. Each one, distinctly personal. When it comes to the Gospel, take it personally. How else could God enter into our lives and reshape our souls to hunger for spiritual food?

Years ago kids in a confirmation class were asked to read the John 3:16 passage, "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." Then, they were asked to replace "the world" with their own names and read it again. They were asked to think about taking God's promise personally.

"He has risen! He has risen indeed!" Once again we come to the Easter season to celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death. He has made that victory ours as well.

Take it personally.


Relay for Life

Notice anything different? I'm having a little fun with the Tools for Living logo. I have reversed the image, so to speak. I want to stress, especially in light of this glorious season of Easter, that as the children of God, we are given the "tools for living" through the example of His Son, Jesus Christ, and His Word.

In effect, Jesus Christ is at the center of our recovery and prevention ministry. The more our ministry team learns about the condi-

tion of addiction, the process of recovery and the means to prevention, the more we are drawn back to the tools God gave us in the first place -- His presence in our lives, His commandments, His unconditional love, His gospel to live as a new creation in Christ because we have been set free by Christ to do that.

Recovery is about being set free from those things that bind us so that we may carry the message of that freedom to others. The 12th step of Alcoholics Anonymous centers on that very theme of "go and do likewise." It states: "Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to others, and to practice these principles in all our affairs."

Are you involved in God's recovery program for humanity? Confession, repentance, forgiveness, affirmation, encouragement, building up the body of Christ, supporting a family of faith, truthfulness, honesty, pressing on toward the goal in spite of failures, and telling the story -- spreading the Good News of our spiritual awakening in Christ -- practicing these principles (striving to live by Christ's example) in all our affairs -- are *all* a part of God's recovery program.

Recovery. It's not just for drug addicts and alcoholics.

Recovery. God desires a recovery from sin for all of His children. God's desire is for us to live in wholeness, to grow and mature spiritually, to live in the abundance of His blessings, and to share the Good News of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

How is your recovery program going? Have you had a spiritual awakening? Share it. Prevent someone from living in darkness and without hope. The Easter story is a good place to start. We have a hope and a future. Recovery is possible -- through Jesus Christ.


