
Therefore, I encourage each and every one of you to consider the best place and scenario for you to be involved in a bible study. An adult bible study class is being led by

## Tenets, Tidbits and Trails ... the Elder's report

Fellow Believers in Christ,

A couple of Sundays ago, I had the humble experience of sharing the message with the congregation. God laid upon my heart the importance of the written word and the word in Jesus, which hopefully I brought about in relationship to the sowing to the seed.

Paul takes this concept of sowing the seeds even further. Paul says we are actually God's letters to the world. In 2 Corinthians 3:2-3, God states you are epistles written in our hearts, known and read by all men, the epistle of Christ written not with ink but with the spirit of the living God; not in tablets of stone, but in fleshy tablets of the heart. Our lives are letters written by the Holy Ghost and sent out to a lost world, and we are being read continually by those around us.

God has sent us, personal letters, to an unconverted humankind. Yet these letters aren't in ink or bound in leather. They are living, breathing, walking scriptures. We embody the gospel of Christ which is the power of God unto the salvation to everyone that believes. The spirit constantly speaks of Christ, making him clearly known to human understanding. ## Confort Zones Award from the Parish Administrator

Concordia Lutheran Church is a comfort zone for me. Over the years I have been blessed by a family of faith who has taken me in like family. When I moved here from Syracuse, New York it meant leaving the familiar comfort zones of friends and another family of faith and entering foreign territory and the unknown. It might as well have been the wild, wild, west.

This is beautiful country. I remember telling my friends back in New York about being able to drive for an hour and not meet a car. There were foxes in town. Horses and cattle stopped traffic. Little did I know that within months of living here I would consider a trip to K-Mart in Craig an outing. Things were different from what I had become comfortable with in New York. I had no idea that I would end up working in a church and being blessed beyond belief by the experience. The unfamiliar Steamboat, in time, became another comfort zone.

In a sense, many of the ministries at Concordia are

about taking a risk and moving out of a personal comfort zone. Outreach and Assimilation would have us invite our neighbors and friends to church. That may be an uncomfortable task for many of us at first -- but practiced over time it can become a natural and comfortable part of our lives.

Stephen Ministry would have us reach out to people in crisis. Many are uncomfortable around people who grieve or face a grave illness. Through training, as we learn to be caregivers, we learn over time and experience to be at ease and comfortable with people who need consistent one-on-one care.

When Christ commands that we pick up the cross and follow Him that might entail carrying that cross outside of our comfort zones and into unfamiliar territory. It can be frightening. It can be downright uncomfortable. The amazing and wondrous thing, however, is that these very emotions can be replaced with comfort and joy. It broadens our experience and helps us to

grow. It forces us to depend more on God and less on the people or environments we're comfortable with.

As I get ready to leave Steamboat, and Concordia in particular, I definitely feel the fear of the unknown and the anxiety of leaving that which is so comfortable. I have had to rely much more on the promises of God to be with me and to give me strength and courage for the journey.

My experience here has flung open more windows of possibility than I had ever considered -- and I don't even feel the door shutting. You have blessed me with opportunities for growth and the ability to use my gifts in very gratifying ways. Thank you for your encouragement and support along the way. I can't begin to convey how much I appreciate the work you have entrusted me with over the years.

God has compelled me to move out of my comfort zone. As a congregation you have had a large part in giving me the ability to take that step. Thank you.






May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you a spirit of unity amount yourselves as you follow Christ Jesus.



## TOOLS FOR LIVING

Have you seen the latest commercials on TV for drug prevention? They're pretty good. They don't stress the eggs frying in a pan with warnings of "this is your brain on drugs." It's a frightening thought but it isn't very effective for deterring drug use. They don't tell you to "just say no." (The comment about that campaign has been, if we could just say no we wouldn't need a Savior.) The Apostle Paul, himself, couldn't just say no. Nor can we. We constantly battle our dual nature of sinner and saint.

These new commercials center on communication. Talk to your kids. Ask them questions. Inquire about their lives. Trust is important. Know where they are. Keep the lines of communication open. Healthy communication between parents and children is the best way to prevent drug and alcohol abuse. That communication can prevent a lot of other things as well - like resentment and bitterness.

In the process of recovery, one of the tools for living that you learn is to communicate better. Learn to be honest about your feelings. Don't stifle resentments. Grumbling *isn't* healthy - speaking the truth in love *is*. Be open and honest with people. If you have a problem or a concern about something go to that person and speak about it. Keep the lines of communication open. Be willing to admit your faults to another person. Ask for forgiveness. Repent. Rejoice in the mending of fractured relationships through healthier communications.


Several weeks ago we had an open forum on worship concerns. It was a wonderful opportunity for our congregation to share their concerns, desires and ideas. It is a good thing to encourage honest communications with one another. We do have different opinions and desires. We don't agree on some issues. But the process of listening to one another allows us to gain a new perspective or insight we had not considered before. What is good for preventing alcohol and drug abuse is also good for us as a congregation. It prevents the resentments and bitterness which can lead to fractures in our congregation. For years I took the grumbling route. I still do sometimes because it seems easier than being honest. Speaking the truth in love, as Jesus did, is not always easy. But if we ignore speaking honestly when we should we run the risk of building up resentments. If you have concerns share them with the appropriate people. Don't *just say nothing*. Keep the lines of communication open.




