





Thoughts from the Pastor

Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.



Ephesians 2:19-22

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

Standing firm in the promises of God, that are fulfilled in Jesus and brought to the world through us, may God's grace, mercy and peace strengthen, protect and inspire you as you journey through the season of Lent in preparation for the most joyous celebration in all of Christendom, the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Over the past several months, much discussion has occurred concerning worship services; including style, content, music, etc. Recently, the question of 'What is worship?' has been asked and discussed. Maybe, before we attempt to answer that question, we should address the question, 'What is church?' According to the bible verses above, church is the whole body of believers, being built up together by the chief cornerstone Himself, Jesus Christ, to become the dwelling of God's Spirit. In other words, 'church' is not brick and mortar, it is not a particular style, music or manmade content, it is you and me, together in spirit, around the things that God says are 'church'. What are those things? Article VII of the Augsburg Confession gives us a guide. It says:

It is also taught among us that one holy Christian church will be and remain forever. This is the assembly of all believers among whom the Gospel is preached in its purity and the holy sacraments are administered according to the Gospel. For it is sufficient for the true unity of the Christian Church that the Gospel be preached in conformity with a pure understanding of it and that the sacraments be administered in accordance with the divine Word. It is not necessary for the true unity of the Christian church that ceremonies, instituted by men, should be observed uniformly in all places. It is as Paul says in Ephesians 4:4-5, "There is one body and one Spirit, just

as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call, one Lord, one faith, one baptism."

The Word and the sacraments are, and always will be, the focal points of our worship services. They are the divine power of God and His workings in our midst for the purpose of bringing people to Himself and for building us up to be His children, serving and loving each other and all we come in contact with. Yet, sometimes, we don't feel like the one unified body of Christ we are meant to be. Sometimes, even though we have all been freely given the one and the same Spirit of God, even though we all have the same Lord and Savior in our lives, there seems to be differing spirits in our midst. Jesus says:

Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth. John 4:23-24

Worshiping in spirit and in truth is the goal of all believers. Joining together as one body, bringing songs and confessions of praise and thanksgiving to God is the desire of the heart that is the dwelling place of God's Spirit. It is what we all desire. To this end, God is leading us to seek unity in Him and to put aside the things that divide us in order that He then will use us to speak His true Word to the community of Steamboat Springs and beyond. The first step will occur during Lent.

Lent is a time of reflection and confession. It is a time to return to God in humble repentance. It is a time to let go of all that has hindered unity in our midst and to open up to His resurrection work in our lives. During the Sundays of Lent, in the sermons, we will look to see what God's Word has to say about worship. The messages during the midweek Lenten services on Wednesdays will also assist us in reflection and repentance. Then, after the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord, we will embark on a spiritual renewal and awakening called '40 Days of Purpose'.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I encourage you to prayerfully submit yourself to the Spirit of God during upcoming weeks, asking our Father in heaven to cleanse, renew, strengthen and build in our lives so that we may be restored to unity of spirit and empowered to be God's witnesses. Jesus says in Revelation 22, Yes, I am coming soon. May our response in word and deed be: Amen. Come Lord Jesus.





You may have noticed a "hole" in the wall downstairs by the bathrooms. We are creating a



The High School Youth Group will meet on Sunday, March 9th for a sledding party. Meet at the church at 3 PM. We will return to the church for dinner afterwards.



TOOLS FOR LIVING

STEP 5

"Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs."

This may be one of the most challenging steps we face in our recovery process, but it can also be one of the most fulfilling in terms of removing us from our isolation. In order to accomplish Step 5, the three-part sharing it endorses must take place. That is, all of what we discovered about ourselves in our Step 4 inventory is to be freely admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being.

There are basically five types of wrongs we should share:

- 1) We need to acknowledge all of our addictions.
- 2) We need to acknowledge what went wrong in our families of origin to initiate our codependent love hungers.
- 3) We need to acknowledge the multi-generational wrongs that may have led to our family of origin situations. We need to understand and be compassionate toward the families our parents emerged from.
- 4) We need to acknowledge the wrongs that have occurred in all major relationships in our lives.
- 5) We need to acknowledge the specific ways in which we have wronged others by the practice of our addictions.

Because these areas are so sensitive and so very personal, it is important to exercise care in choosing the person or persons with whom we formally share our fifth step. Such individuals should be trustworthy and somewhat detached from the situations about which we will share. For example, one would not usually call on a spouse or immediate family member to hear this confession. In fact, it is quite common to choose a therapist or pastoral counselor for this purpose. Also, such individuals should be compassionate, not condemning.

Four very positive things happen in Step 5 sharing:

- 1) Our shame is reduced through confession. We know that confession is an ancient tradition in Christianity and that it is an indispensable ingredient in the healing and renewal process.
- 2) Step 5 sharing allows us to express our grief-to expel the resentments, the anger, the fears that eat away at us and keep us from living life to the fullest.
- 3) We take a major step toward honesty. Perhaps the single greatest barrier to recovery is the inability to be honest. In Step 5 sharing, maybe for the first time in our lives, we open on deepest, darkest secrets and most private hurts to another human being.
- 4) Addictions, by their very nature, isolate us from other people and from God. Step 5 sharing breaks down the barriers we have erected through our addictions.

Step 5 sharing is the beginning of the end of our isolation.
