A PURPOSE DRIVEN LIFE

We have just finished 40 days of training on how to manage our lives to God's glory and the continuous building of His kingdom. Have we as individuals improved our life management by 10%, 20% or more? If so we should be able to see an effect on the whole church family at Concordia. Are we more patient and less judgmental? Are we repairing injured relationships? Are we seeking ways to serve? Are we spending more time in fellowship with our church family? I see some positive signs. I hope and pray we all see positive signs that our lives are becoming more purpose driven.

Stewardship is another word that can be used to describe a purpose driven life. Stewardship is how we manage all of our time, talent and treasure in the life we have given over to Christ.

Now to the purpose that drives my life right now. It's back to where it always ends up with the Stewardship chairperson at Concordia. - 1. Just because you go vacationing, golfing, camping or working instead of attending church doesn't cause the expenses at Concordia to stop any more than it causes your household expenses to stop. Your normal contribution to Concordia should continue.
- 2. A DCE staff person is coming in August. She is an intern and will be here for one year. This person has not been included in the year to date budget figures reported in the bulletin. The cost increase will be about \$450 to \$550 per week. This is a 10% increase in your personal level of giving. Concordia supplies salary plus housing for the DCE intern.



We will also be having our HIGHWAY CLEAN UP DAY. A date and time will be announced in the bulletin. This is always a fun time to do our community service together.


