Thoughts from the Pastor


The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham....

In the November 19th Portals of Prayer daily devotion titled "Empty Promises" the author talks about the differences between the empty promises of human beings who are at times unable to keep the promises they make due to 'circumstances beyond our control' and the eternally fulfilled promises of the One who is in charge and command of all of creation, all of history and all of eternity. Eternal life, the Word of God promises, is given to all by the grace of God through faith in this son of David and Son of God, Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

The genealogies of Matthew and Luke serve to remind us first of the promises God has made, second, and most important that God is faithful in fulfilling, completely by Himself, the promises He has made. During the midweek Advent services we will be looking at certain parts of the genealogies of our Savior in order to be blessed and uplifted by once again hearing of the promises of God fulfilled in His Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Come and be filled by the soup suppers and by the Word of God on Wednesday, December 3rd, 10th, and 17th and invite others to come and be fed as well so that as we once again behold our Lord on Christmas Day we may join together with Simeon in singing praise to God as he held the Christ child:

Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation that you have prepared before all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel. Luke 2:29-32 (ESV)




LWML (Women's Guild) News...
