Who thinks of things like that? And what does it actually mean? So, I looked it up. I didn't find the culprit that invented it, but I did find a definition. Webster's Dictionary defines it as: gloomy or sad. Some of its synonyms are: despondent, downhearted, pensive, and somber. But some of its antonyms are: happy, cheerful, and merry. As I was pondering these words and how they fit in my life I was made aware again that sometimes the trials we go through in life try and rob us of our enjoyment of all that's going on. They try to steal away our joy. There have been several times in my life when I have been carrying around burdens that have caused me to lose sight of something very important: Sin and sorrow and suffering can never take away the love of Jesus. That is all I need to know. Even in times when my heart is heavy, underneath it all, there is always joy. There is laughter. There is friendship. There is Jesus. The weight of our burdens can never squash the foundation that was laid before we were born. With Love all things are possible. 1 Corinthians Chapter 13 sums it up very well if you want to give it a read. I pray your new year becomes an experience of the Love God intended.


