REFLECT HIS GRACE

Dear Friends,

March '04

Have you ever been to one of those retreats or seminars where the speaker talks about how messed up they were in their past, and then about how God miraculously pulled them out of the pit they fell into? I have. They never cease to amaze me. I am frequently reminded of how God can save us from the biggest messes we get ourselves in. I'm so thankful for the way that God worked in their lives and for the testimony they have to share and reach others with. But I used to walk away a little discouraged because I don't have a story like that to witness with. I have had the blessing of being a Christian all my life. I grew up in a family that went to church every week and prayed before every meal. Maybe you did too...

But here's the deal: as effective and powerful as those testimonies are, we don't need a story of that magnitude to witness to God's amazing grace. The angry words I spoke last week were enough to nail Jesus to the cross. The resentment I felt this morning was enough to put a canyon between God and I that I couldn't possibly cross. The forgiveness Jesus offers to me after I've committed the same sin for the hundredth time is the most powerful testimony I can share.

No matter what your past looks like, or what you struggle with on a daily basis, God's forgiveness is for you. Christ's sacrifice allows us to step out from the guilt we hold onto and into the freedom of grace. Forget about the past—"...as far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us..." God wants to use you just the way you are use this gift of grace as a testimony. Let your lives reflect this unconditional love God has for you. And live in the knowledge that nothing you could do or have done is enough to separate you from the One who gave His life for you.

Greetings and God's peace to all my brothers and sisters in Christ.

God has blessed us in uncountable ways, from the beauty of this land and the freedoms we enjoy here, to our families, friends, work, etc. Praise be to God!

At this point you are probably preparing for a pitch to give money to help us weather our financial crunch! Sorry, but even though I encouraged you to give the other Sunday, God is the one who needs to move people to give to the church, I don't really think I can. Besides, those who read this are the ones who are probably already giving.

Rather, my purpose is to touch on several other points of our faith.

Prayer that God's will be done.

Acceptance of God's will in our lives.

Giving our lives to God's will, not our will.

Before I began this letter I prayed God would guide my words and hand to his glory because I do not take my responsibility to my God or to this church lightly. In the same way we prayed for God to guide us in calling a pastor.

This is what Missouri Synod congregations consider an act of faith. We believe the Holy Spirit will guide the man He wants to be here to accept the call. If we don't this is only another job to be done.

The only way that calling can be challenged is for non-scriptural teaching or immoral behavior, otherwise we accept God's guiding. If we choose not to accept the pastor God has sent to us, then all of our other beliefs are suspect.

We are a Missouri Synod congregation, and although a few of its' practices may cause disagreement, our theology based on the in-errant scripture is sound. One thing to remember, this is not an emotional faith! We may have come to faith in Jesus because of emotional needs, Great! Or we may react to Jesus' love for us emotionally. Wonderful!!

But Jesus' death and resurrection are a fact! That God has called us to His Son to be saved is a fact!

Use that knowledge to guide your head and heart. Love those who are in this congregation, build up do not tear down. Our emotions can be used to give God glory or to glorify ourselves and our wants.

You may choose to pray that God would call Pastor Scott somewhere else. That is acceptable. But do not fall into the trap of believing you know better than God what is needed here and try to force Him out.

Believe it! God is guiding this congregation! God brought Pastor Scott to us and will take him somewhere else in His time, not ours.

Please, I pray work for God's will, not our own. It is our responsibility as Christians.

Critic or Paralytic

Mark 2:5-6, he said to the paralytic, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Now some Of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts.

Critic or paralytic, which are you? Mark tells the story of those four fellows who knew their friend needed Jesus. They were so desperate that they were willing to interrupt Jesus' preaching by tearing a gaping hole in the roof to get their friend into His presence. Whatever the cost, it was worth it! Their Savior was doling out forgiveness, and that was what their friend desperately needed.

The Savior speaks, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Whether we like it or not, we are all paralytics. Our paralyzed-by-sin hearts and tongues are unable to love God and to speak well of our neighbor. So the Lord had someone carry us to His preaching, whether that was our parents to the Baptismal font or the invitation of a friend to attend a worship service.

But there were those who complained. "Who can forgive sins but God alone?" (v. 7). Of course, the critics were right. Only God can forgive, and it was God there in the flesh who was forgiving sin. Critics, however, get tripped up over their own pride because they are the only ones who know the right way. No one can tell them differently, not even God!

I write this column because we —God's workers— can get caught up with our ways as opposed to others' ways just as easily as people outside the church. We can get caught up with my way versus your way. We can get caught up with my way versus God's way. "Why do I have to deal with that person?" "I'm not going to!" "God, why did You place me here anyway!" "God, Your Word is too hard for me to believe on this point. I'll just ignore it!"

Yet, life lived as a paralytic is far better than life lived as a critic. A paralytic realizes that everyday —every situation and every person— is God's gift. Every place where He puts His workers is a Garden of Eden. Every jot and tittle of His Word is true and good no matter how reason rebels. Every task assigned by Him is for Him and given from a merciful heart so that we can serve Him by serving others.

We gladly confess that we are totally and completely at the mercy of God. We gladly confess that we are rich in sin and He in forgiveness. And therefore, the task He has given us to do and the people He has given us to serve, and the Word He has given us to believe, are viewed as pure privilege and gift. We are surprised not only at His forgiveness—"My son, you sins are forgiven"—but that He has called us to work in His vineyard. My, what a Lord!
