Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

God's grace, mercy and peace to all of you in name of the only Savior of mankind, the Lord Jesus Christ.

As we saw a couple of weeks ago, St. Paul, in the fourth chapter of his letter to the Christians in Ephesus describes the unity that is in the body of Christ and how the individual Christian is to live as part of the unified body of Christ. In verses 4 and 5 he lays out the vision, if you will, that unifies the body and inspires its service. St. Paul writes: There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to one hope when you were called – one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

In response to this, I have been asked what my vision is for this congregation. I have prayed about this for many months and my answer is two-fold.

First and foremost, the vision for this congregation must begin in the only place it can begin for any part of the body of Christ, with God's vision for His people. It is what St. Paul referred to in Ephesians 4 and it is what Jesus Himself talks about in John 14 as He comforts His disciples in light of His impending crucifixion. He says: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." When Philip asks Jesus to show them the Father, Jesus' says: "Anyone who has seen Me has seen the Father." Jesus is the supernatural appearance of God in the very natural package of flesh and bone. He is the manifestation to the senses of the immaterial reality that salvation is given by the grace of God the Father alone as He sees fit. Jesus is Messiah, the ONLY Messiah. He is the "one Lord" written of by St. Paul in Ephesians and He is the only source of life and message for Paul to the world. Therefore, Jesus is the vision for this congregation and for all Christians throughout time.

In light of that, my vision for Concordia Lutheran Church is that this part of the body of Christ truly come to accept and understand that there is no other way to heaven, there is no other path to God, there is no other faith that saves, than Jesus Christ. Then, that this part of the body of Christ begin to reach out to this community with that eternal life-giving message, understanding that all Christians have been called by God to be disciples by making disciples. Finally, that all of the ministries and work of Concordia Lutheran Church may be unified under this vision and directed by this truth. That is the reason for the summer sermon series on Ephesians and for the forthcoming events that will directly focus on outreach discipleship.

Therefore, pray! Pray that the Lord of the Church blesses us to this end and that He grants to us His Holy Spirit to guide and direct our ways and efforts. Pray that we, as redeemed children of God, my find the same joy in telling others about Jesus that I saw in the young people of Ongoing Ambassadors for Christ who visited and canvassed our community on our behalf. Pray! God bless you all.

What a great, solid verse God has given us in Scripture. I was thinking about this verse the other day and how important it is in our society today. We live in a world where everything is relative. Things are only sometimes true or right. Other times, they just don't apply. Or, maybe "something is true for you...but that doesn't make it true for me." "And you know, as long as they serve their god with all their heart, they will get to heaven just like us." "Why don't you just pick a faith that suits you the best; you'll be fine. Everyone serves the same god; he just has different names." "You can't force your God on me; it's all the same anyway." "How dare you claim to have the only way to heaven." I tell you what folks, in a world where people think everything is gray and relative, and that there are choices for everything, I am so thankful that we have the solid truth to



I know it is much more comfortable to say that everyone is okay where they are at. And as long as they go to some kind of church every once in awhile, they are fine. But Scripture is very clear about one thing: There is only ONE God. In Ephesians 4 it says, "...One LORD, One faith, One baptism; One God and Father of all." This verse and the one above do not leave us much room to wiggle on how salvation is attained. Jesus is the only way to heaven. That doesn't make us close minded; it makes us absolutely certain of our eternity. It is not the Pastor or the synod that comes up with a statement like that. It is Scripture. Many religions in the world say that their god is the same as the Christian God. This is simply not true. Where other gods call for killing and hating of other religions, ours calls for love, forgiveness, and evangelism. When other gods ask for a certain amount of goodness or rule following, ours gave us forgiveness for our shortcomings. When other gods demand payment for their sins, our God gave us Jesus.

I am so thankful that I can stand where I am and say that Jesus is my Savior, and proclaim without a doubt that my eternity is secure because of His sacrifice for me. In a world that demands freedom for all, let us not forget the freedom that has been won for us. We are given both the freedom and the responsibility to tell others the way to heaven—the ONE WAY. Do not be afraid to speak this truth. Because that is what it is—Truth; God's truth.

With a truth like this in our possession, how is it that we can get so distracted? What is it about society that makes being politically correct more appealing than living in the truth that comes directly from God? And why is it that we are often focused on the things we feel are wrong or not the way they should be, instead of on the love and salvation Jesus gives us through His sacrifice?

Our church has been struggling for several months now with issues that would take up more room than I'm given in this Christogram. My plea is that we could all take a step back and regain our focus. If every person in this church would take a step outside and look in, I think they would see that we have lost sight of the cross. Some are focused on the changes that have taken place in the last two years that they don't like. Some are focused on how negative things seem to be. And some are focused on the one solution they think will make all our problems go away. Has anyone noticed what's missing here? In all the concerns that have been brought up, addressed, and worked on, none of them involve Jesus. In Matthew 18:20"Where two or more are gathered in My Name, there I am among them." What has happened to the cross? While satan is distracting us with the shortcomings and downfalls around us, Jesus is still working here among us. People are joining the church. We have visitors almost every Sunday. Fellow believers are being baptized. Over 70 children heard the word of God during VBS this past month. God is at work in this church. We just sometimes forget to look for Him.

We have been given the greatest gift ever—Jesus Christ. He promises never to leave us. He promises to give us exactly what we need when we need it. And He promises to love us despite ourselves. Do we think He has forgotten our little church here? Trust in the God we serve. Live in the truth of His love and salvation. And don't be afraid to claim that truth, both in our church lives and in our lives outside of these four walls. Don't forget that God sees us. And He will mold us, shape us, and moves us at the right time. God is here friends. We need to take a stand and decide—each one for themselves—that we will not be destroyed by satan. We have to work together, in unity, faith, truth and love. Our idea of the right solution may not be the right solution. But there is Someone who knows what the right solution is, and He will not leave us to fall apart.

I pray this month that the Truth of Jesus burns inside of you like a blazing fire. May it be so strong that we must speak of it or we will not survive, just like the prophet Jeremiah. Use this gift of truth; don't be afraid. And know that God is right beside you. May it always be in your heart and on your mind. Peace to all of you.

Greetings in the name of Jesus our Salvation,

Now as an LCMS pastor, he reminds us that with the Holy Spirit's power, there is no such thing as a lost cause.

Today Merino serves as pastor of New Life Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne where the goal is to be a church for "all nations." The city is a site for refugee placement, and the church has become home to Gypsies, Burmese, Hispanics and others. The church seeks to bring unreached peoples to Christ, to develop them as leaders and equip them to plant churches. Leadership training has helped members carry on the ministry as Merino traveled to other parts of the country and Eastern Europe to consult in Gypsy ministry.


