A heartfelt thank you to all of the women of Concordia who put together the wonderful reception following the Memorial Service for Lisa Koch.


Have you noticed how wonderful the front landscaping and lawn looks? A big thank you to Ron Wentzel for his hard work and making the front of the church so beautiful!

The shares of this World Servants Mission Project offered hereby are being sold by members of the Concordia Lutheran Church of Steamboat Springs, Colorado to provide funds for participation in the July 2007 World Servants Crow Indian Nation Mission Project, as described herein.

World Servants is a worldwide, multi-cultural organization. serving as an agent of change by developing people as servants and leaders. People are challenged and developed through dynamic mission trips that have long-term impact both on the volunteer participants and the local communities, while assisting these communities to become self-sustaining and interdependent. Established in 1986, World Servants have facilitated short-term mission trips for over 30,000 participants and trained thousands of teams for cross-cultural ministry.

THE PROJECT

Concordia's 2007 Mission Trip will be spent working with the Crow Indian Nation and World Servants at Crow Agency, Montana. The group will leave Steamboat Springs on July 8, 2007 and return July 14, 2007. The trip will be a work camp, not a vacation. Hot, and sometimes dirty work, is expected from participants for the week they will spend in Montana. The work will include construction and renovation projects at individual homes, community buildings or churches. Various projects will include painting, repairing siding, installing windows, doors, flooring (tile/carpet), placing drywall, framing, building decks or wheelchair ramps, constructing trusses or repairing and installing roofing.

The team will also work with the community in a number of other creative and culturally appropriate ways such as a Kids Club/Sports Camp, free car washes, visits to the local nursing home or a mini VBS. Volunteers may also plan and staff a carnival at the park one evening and will certainly experience worship time with a local congregation. Our goal is to partner with the community we are going to serve.

We enter the local community humbly as their guests. It is not our intent or purpose to condemn, judge, change or convert. Similarly we will not change lifestyles or rearrange value systems and customs for the local community. Our purpose is to share our talents, skills and caring with fellow human beings in the Christian spirit of love and acceptance.

PROJECT FINANCING

World Servants mission work camps rely entirely on gifts from the participating groups. The gifts cover costs of all on-site materials and other project related expenses. Each participant in the Concordia project will contribute a minimum of \$100 to partially cover room and board. In addition the team must provide its own transportation to and from the project center and the outlying work sites. Participants also supply many of their work tools and equipment. Concordia's Mission Team budget for the 2007 project, based on 15 participants, will be approximately \$8,000. All funds will go directly towards the work team donations, room, board, transportation and other mission trip expenses.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION

Each participate is required to complete at least the following in preparation for the mission work camp:

Participate in the fund raising efforts by selling shares of stock in this project

Contribute a minimum of \$100 personal funds

Contribute preparation time in the following areas:

Assistance with trip planning activities

Attendance at 2 training and orientation sessions


