Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I shared this devotion at the recent Voter's meeting, and I wanted to share it with the rest of you. It was early in 1945. As U.S. forces pushed deep into Okinawa they came across a village unlike any they had seen before. At Shimabuku they were met and welcomed by two old men who invited the troops in as "fellow Christians".

Correspondent Clarence W. Hall described it this way: "We'd seen other Okinawan villages, all down at the heels and despairing. But in this one, we were greeted with smiles and dignified bows. Proudly old men showed us their spotless homes, terraced fields, storehouses and grainaries – along with their prized sugar mill."

Searching for an answer as to why this one was so different, Hall uncovered an incredible story. Some 30 years before, and American missionary, on his way to Japan, had paused and stayed only long enough to make two converts and leave them a Japanese translated Bible. The converts were instructed to live by God's Word. They began to share their faith with their neighbors and eventually, the whole village came to faith. They all followed the Bible completely.

They adopted the 10 commandments as their legal code, and the Sermon on the Mount as their guide in social conduct. They taught the Bible in their schools and made court decisions based on it. As a result, there were no jails, no bars, no drunkenness, no divorce, and a high level of happiness. Hall was moved by what he found there.

After the war came to an end, Hall began to wonder what had happened to the village. 15 years later he went back and found that while modern civilization had swallowed Okinawa, the spiritual influence of Shimabuku had remained. He thought back to what his Jeep driver had said 15 years earlier: "So, this is what comes out of a Bible and a couple of old guys who wanted to live like Jesus." Then the driver looked at a shell hole not far from the Jeep and said: "Maybe we're using the wrong weapons to make this world over."

Jesus said: "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to all creation." (Mark 16:15) We should never underestimate the power of the Gospel which God has placed in our hands in the Holy Bible! I believe that God can use us to make some amazing changes in our world as well!
