Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As a young boy, I was mesmerized by all the different things that were a part of the State Fair of Texas. One of the things that fascinated me was the booth where a man sold chameleons. A chameleon would be a really cool thing to have back in my neighborhood. Not only could they change colors, but they looked like they came from a prehistoric past. There were a lot of lizards around where I grew up...but no "color changers" like the chameleon.

Now this isn't a beautiful lizard...but it was a fascinating one for a boy. The chameleon has a compressed body, a conical head, and big bug-eyes that move independently of each other. It has clawed toes and a long tail for clinging to branches. Its tongue darts in and out as it snatches insects.

But the main attraction was that it could change colors inside its thick lizard skin. Imagine different colored cells like marbles in a jelly substance. The roving eyes of the chameleon are sensitive to certain waves of light which signals those cells to react in their skin so that different colored cells move to the surface in order to help them blend into their surroundings. The color changes are obviously limited, but they do help the chameleon blend in.

People can't change color cells, but we can often become like a chameleon. It seems easier to blend in with our surroundings rather than to stand out. While this trait helps a chameleon, it is not always helpful to us. We get squeezed into the mold of the majority, which can lead us to things we really don't want to do. That runs counter to our Savior's call: "You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16) Discipleship means "playing for the Coach, not for the crowd." We are called to stand up for Jesus and stand out boldly against the backdrop of the world's colors.

God isn't looking for chameleons. Henry David Thoreau wrote: "If a man does not keep pace with his companions, perhaps it is because he hears a different drummer. Let him step to the music that he hears, however measured or far away." God calls us to march to his music. That will make us out of step with many in our word...but being in step with God is by far the better way.
